





Our medical clinic provides non-invasive medical care that promotes physical and emotional healing from the trauma of sexual assault and abuse. Services are provided by specialized attending physicians, nursing staff, medical social workers, and medical assistants.

Our team of specially trained forensic nurses are available 24/7 at seven hospital emergency departments across King County to provide medical forensic exams for individuals affected by sexual assault or domestic violence, including nonfatal strangulation.

Trauma Counseling Services

Our trauma counseling includes providing information and referrals, crisis intervention, advocacy, therapeutic intervention, therapeutic case management, and evidence-based trauma focused therapy for children, adolescents, and adults. Our community-based mobile advocacy services provide outreach to high-risk populations and the provision of systems navigation support, medical and legal advocacy.

Foster Care Assessment Program (FCAP)

The Foster Care Assessment Program is contracted with the Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF). When significant barriers to permanency prevent children from returning home or finding an alternate permanent plan, since 1998, DCYF has relied on the expertise of FCAP evaluators to provide comprehensive assessment and consultation on the most complex cases impacting reunification of children and youth in care.

Demographics

African American and Native American/Indigenous children continue to be disproportionally represented in Washington's child welfare system. FCAP is committed to identifying and eliminating biases that negatively impact permanency for all children, especially those who are disproportionately represented.

K-12 Sexual Health Education Project:



HATC used federal funding to pilot a sexual health education program for high school students. The project served to help school districts comply with Washington State law RCW 28A.300.475, which requires school districts to develop comprehensive sexual health education in grades nine through twelve. HATC used federal funding to develop and pilot a sexual health education curriculum called Healthy Connections for high school students.


Statewide Research & Training

In collaboration with the UW Department of Psychology, HATC provides training and consultation in trauma-informed evidence-based treatments to community behavioral healthcare organizations and professionals.


CETA (Common Elements Treatment Approach) is a cognitive behavioral therapy used to treat anxiety, depression, and posttraumatic stress disorders in adults aged 18 and over.

CBT+ (Cognitive Behavioral Therapy) is another transdiagnostic cognitive behavioral treatment used in the treatment of anxiety, depression, PTSD, and mild to moderate behavioral issues in youth ages 4-21.




