Students take an average of one Honors Core course per quarter, but have some flexibility in planning, to allow for departmental requirements and other opportunities. To determine which Honors courses you must complete for graduation, please see the Honors Core Requirements worksheet.

** Students may register for Honors 496 when they have completed 6 of the 9 Honors Core courses and both of their required Experiential Learning requirements. Honors 496 does not have to be taken the quarter of graduation.
