

Joy Williamson-Lott is an Associate Professor in the College of Education at the University of Washington, Seattle. Her training is in the history of American education with a specialization in African American educational history. She has published several chapters in edited volumes as well as articles in the *Journal of Negro Education*, *History of Education Quarterly*, and *History of Higher Education Annual*. Also, she has written two manuscripts: *Black Power on Campus: The University of Illinois, 1965-1975* (2003), and *Radicalizing the Ebony Tower: Black Colleges and the Black Freedom Struggle in Mississippi* (2008). Her current research project investigates the internal and external pressures experienced by black and white colleges across the South between the mid-1950s and mid-1970s. She teaches courses on the history of American education, theoretical debates in the history of education, education as a moral endeavor, and education for liberation.
