

Stephanie E. Smallwood received her PhD in American History from Duke University in 1999. She was an Assistant Professor of History at the University of California, San Diego, from 1998-2006, and has been Associate Professor of History at the University of Washington, Seattle since 2007. Her research and teaching focus on precolonial Atlantic Africa and the African diaspora in the Americas, racial slavery in the Americas, and the early modern histories of European overseas expansion and cross-cultural encounters among Europeans, Africans and indigenous peoples in the colonial Americas. She is the author of *Saltwater Slavery: A Middle Passage from Africa to American Diaspora* (Harvard, 2007), winner of the 2008 Frederick Douglass Prize awarded by Yale University's Gilder Lehrman Center for the Study of Slavery, Resistance and Abolition. She has begun work on a new project tentatively titled *Africa in the "Atlantic World": Historical Geographies of Power and Possibility*.
