McNair Program Application

The Ronald E. McNair Program is federally funded by the Department of Education to prepare low-income, first generation undergraduates and undergraduates from underrepresented groups for doctoral study through involvement in research and scholarly activities. Program Benefits

The program offers a challenging and supportive environment that is conducive to learning and personal/professional development. As a McNair Scholar, you will receive:

- The support of McNair Program Advisors
- Research opportunities
- Generous research stipends and travel allowances
- Faculty mentoring
- Workshops on the graduate school application process
- Assistance in locating graduate schools
- Access to standardized test preparation software
- Access to tutoring and the OMA&D Instructional Center
- Assistance in locating and applying to research internships
- Assistance in locating funding/financial aid resources
- Opportunities for participation in research conferences

Participant Eligibility

To be eligible for acceptance into the McNair Program, you must be currently enrolled as an undergraduate in a degree program at the University of Washington. In addition, you:

- Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Must be a low-income student who is also a first-generation college student (neither parent or legal guardian has a Bachelor's degree)

or

Must be a member of a group that is underrepresented in graduate education (African American, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Hispanic/Latino or Native Hawaiian /Pacific Islander)

- Must have completed 36 credits by the time of initial entry into the program
- Must have at least one year remaining before graduation (i.e., if you are graduating within the year, you are not eligible for the program)
- Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of: 2.8 (sophomores), 3.0 (juniors), 3.2 (seniors)
- Must express STRONG desire to attain a Ph.D.

- A copy of college transcript from each institution you have attended, including the UW (unofficial is fine)
- A copy of your financial aid award letter and 2015 income tax return (for dependent students, your parent's return)
- A writing sample of at least two pages that was completed within the last year (e.g., a paper from a course)

Statement of Purpose

Please write a single essay addressing the following topics and attach it to your application. Please limit your statement to a maximum of two pages, with double spacing, 1-inch margins and using 11 or 12 pt font (Times New Roman or Arial). Your essays should incorporate the following details.

- 1. Personal background
 - Please describe your family and educational background.
 - Describe any financial, familial, or personal responsibilities that you may have that will require your attention during the next couple of years? (This is in addition to regular academic work.)
- 2. Academic interests
 - What research topics, fields or departments do you find most interesting?
 - Please describe your research experiences, if any.
 - Discuss your academic interests and plans (major(s), minor(s) etc.). Talk about what you enjoy and hope to learn from this field.
 - What Ph.D. program (major) do you intend to pursue?
 - Are you interested in a career in academia (i.e., as a professor at a college or university)? What do you hope to gain from and contribute to academia?
- 3. Community involvement—
 - What extracurricular activities do you participate in?
 - Describe your volunteer activities or ways in which you "give back" to your community.
 - In what ways do you see yourself as a role model for, or in what ways do you hope to become a role model in the future?
- 4. Impact of the McNair program—
 - Discuss how the McNair program can help you attain your goals.
 - Discuss how you see yourself contributing to the McNair/TRIO community.

References (please read carefully)

Current first year students, sophomores, and transfer students (based on years in school, not credits) need one letter from a professor, lecturer, instructor, teaching assistant, academic counselor, or undergraduate advisor. An additional letter from a

UW faculty member is encouraged, but not required.

Current Juniors and Seniors are required to submit two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a UW faculty member with an earned Ph.D. We encourage you to get an additional letter from a UW faculty.

but letters from a lecturer, instructor, teaching assistant, academic counselor, or undergraduate advisor are also acceptable.

Fill out the top portion of the form and give it to your recommender. The recommender should return the form directly to the McNair Program at the address provided on the form.

Directions for Submitting your Letter(s) of Reference:

- 1) Contact your letter writers, telling them that you will be applying to the McNair program (remember to provide your writers with plenty of time to write you a strong letter.)
- 2) Provide the UW McNair program with the name, email, title and department of your letter writer(s) via email. (uwmcnair@uw.edu). In your subject line write: Reference Submission for (your name).
- 3) We will send your letter writer an email with the instructions for writing and uploading an electronic copy. We will send out your email within 24 hours (M-Th) of receipt of your email, so make sure you provide us with the name(s) and email(s) as soon as you are starting your application.
