The gastroenterology fellowship at the University of Washington has been providing training in research, clinical gastroenterology, and teaching since 1950. Our division is composed of twenty-four full time faculty members who have clinical responsibilities and research operations in five hospitals (University of Washington Medical Center, Puget Sound Health Care System Seattle VA Medical Center, Harborview Medical Center, Pacific Medical Clinics, and the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center).
