



Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners (ARNPs)

Advanced registered nurse practitioners (ARNPs) include nurse anesthetists, nurse midwives, and nurse practitioners. In Washington State, ARNPs must also hold active registered nurse licenses. The following Washington statistics were calculated based on data from the ARNP license files, which contain licensee name, mailing address, age, and gender. No information is currently available on other licensee demographic or practice characteristics (e.g., no data are available regarding race/ethnicity or employment status).

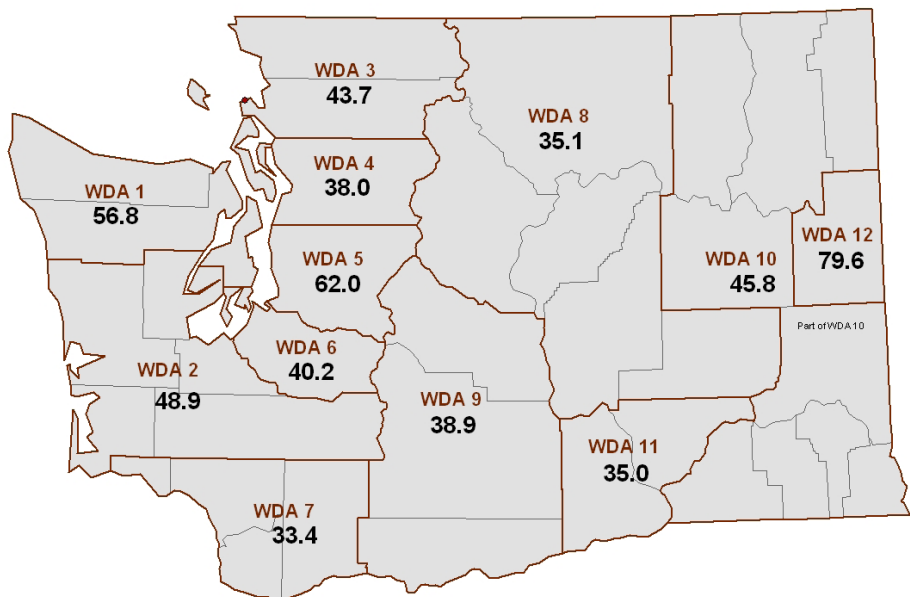

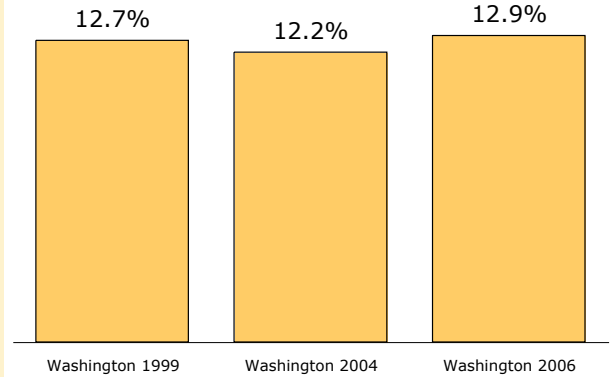
Washington ARNPs with Active Licenses per 100,000 Population by Workforce Development Area (WDA)*

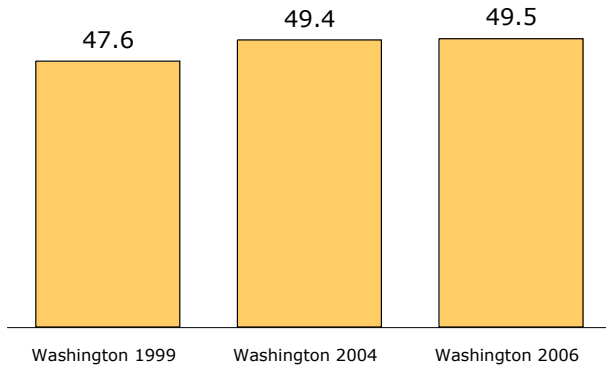
ARNP Gender

Percent of ARNPs with Active Licenses Who Are Male

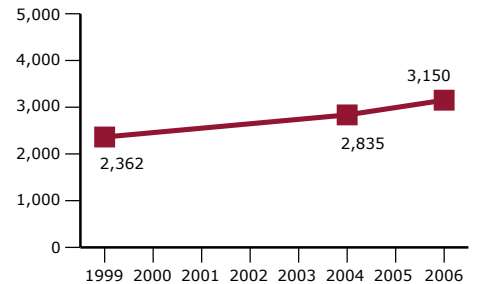


ARNP Age

Mean Age of ARNPs with Active Licenses

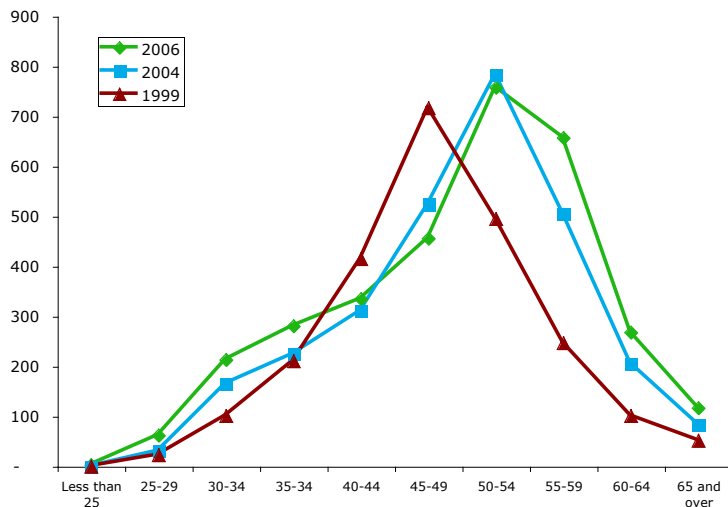


Number of ARNPs with Active Licenses and Washington Addresses* from 1999 to 2006
