Licensed practical nurses (LPNs) in Washington are licensed through the State Department of Health. The following Washington statistics were calculated based on data from these license files, which contain licensee name, mailing address, age, and gender.

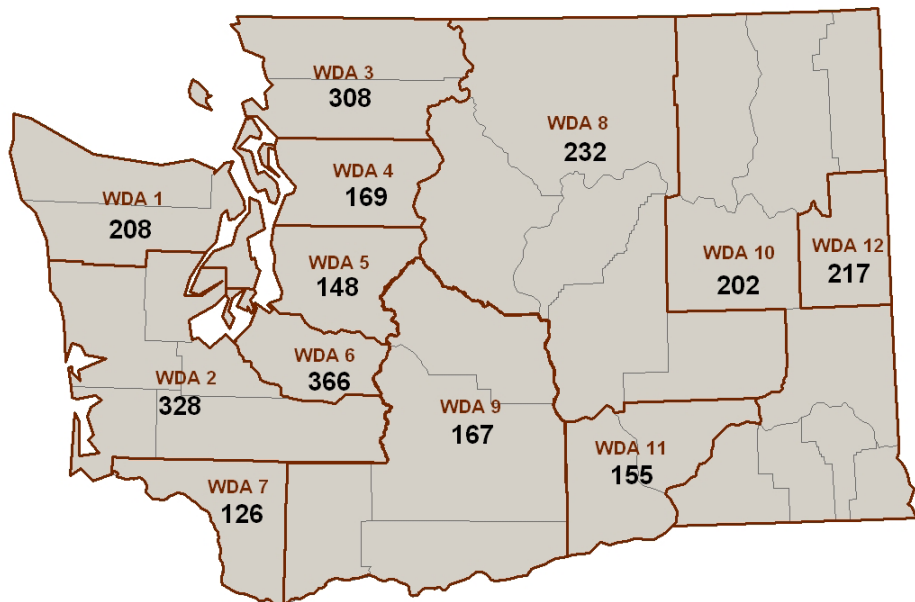

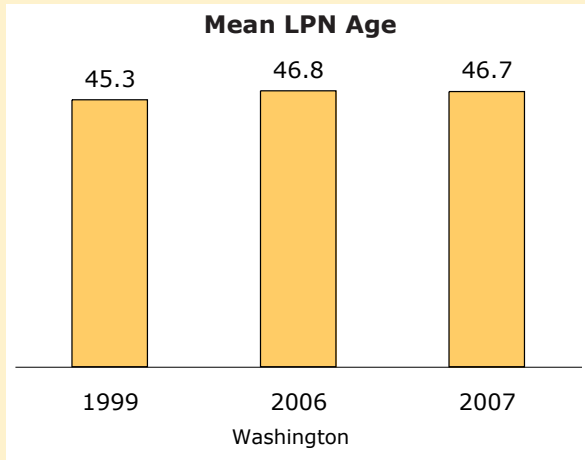

Washington LPNs with Active Licenses per 100,000 Population by Workforce Development Area (WDA)*

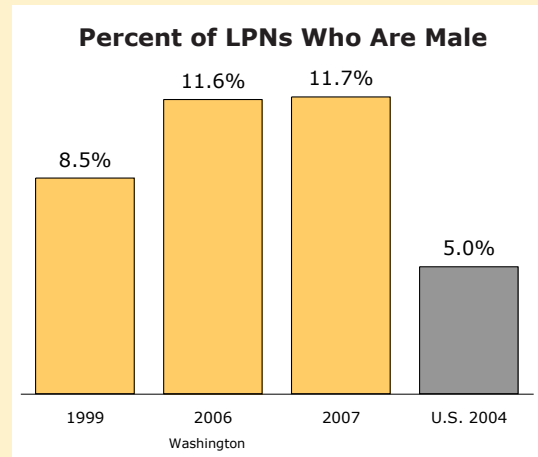

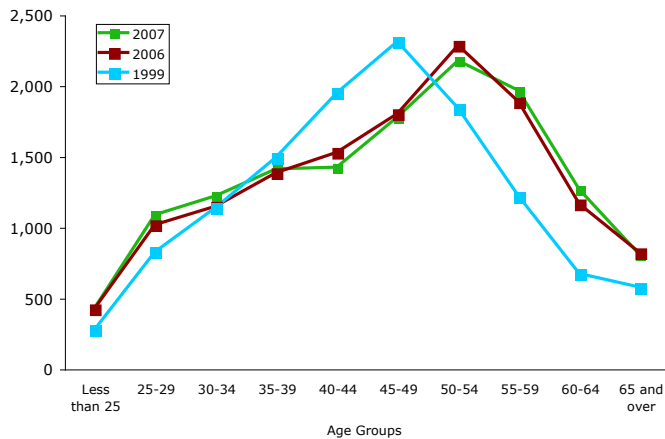
LPN Age



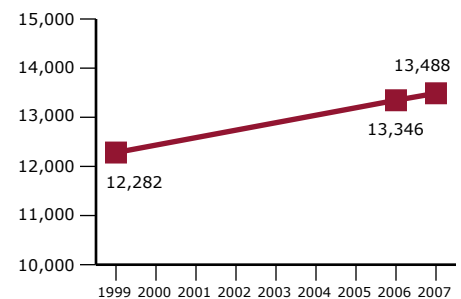
LPN Gender



Age of Washington State LPNs with Active Licenses, by Age Group

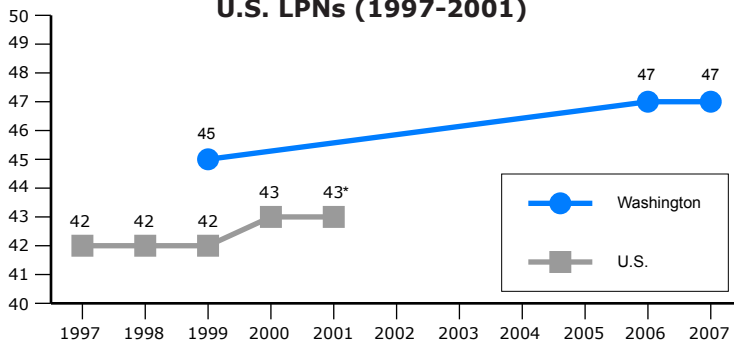


Number of LPNs with Active Licenses and Washington Addresses* from 1999 to 2007
