Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs)

Licensed practical nurses (LPNs) in Washington are licensed through the State Department of Health. The following Washington statistics were calculated based on data from these license files, which contain licensee name, mailing address, age, and gender. No information is currently available on other licensee demographic or practice characteristics (e.g., no data are available regarding race/ethnicity or employment status).

With Idaho addresses†	196 (1.3%)




Number of LPNs with active licenses by WDA

Washington LPNs with Active Licenses per 100,000 Population by Workforce Development Area (WDA)*




LPN Age





LPN Gender
