Wyoming Dentists, 2009

Licensed Dentists

Dentists must hold an active Wyoming license to practice in Wyoming. The following Wyoming statistics were calculated based on data from dentist licensing records and a survey of all licensees conducted for the Wyoming Healthcare Commission in early 2009.

■ There were an estimated 48 licensed dentists with a Wyoming address per 100,000 Wyoming state residents in 2009. According to the American Dental Association's data, there were 76 dentists per 100,000 U.S. population in 2006 (the most recent year of available data).




Dentists with a Primary Practice Location in Wyoming


■ 59% of licensed dentists responding to the survey reported that they were practicing and their primary work location was in Wyoming. The following findings are based only on the survey responses of dentists with a primary practice location in Wyoming, referred to as "Wyoming dentists."

Wyoming Dentist Demographics

- 9% of Wyoming dentists were female.
- 99% of Wyoming dentists recorded their race as white, in combination with no other races.
- 2% of Wyoming dentists were of Hispanic or Latino origin.









■ 13% of Wyoming dentists planned to retire in the next five years.




Wyoming Dentists' Employment Characteristics




- Wyoming dentists in active practice worked an average of 40 total hours weekly.
- 12% worked fewer than 30 hours per week.









Data and Funding Sources: Licensing data are from the Wyoming Board of Dental Examiners. The University of Washington Center for Health Workforce Studies (UW CHWS) developed the survey questionnaire, and the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center at the University of Wyoming conducted the survey May-July 2009 (response rate 66%). Population data are from the U.S. Census Bureau. National dentist data are from the American Dental Association, "Distribution of Dentists in the United States by Region and State, 2006." The analyses for this report were conducted by the UW CHWS with funding from the Wyoming Healthcare Commission.
