MORE LANDLORDS TO BE REGULATED

Fair Rentals Bureau Has Many Protests of Raised Rents to Be Heard This Week.

Further investigation of excessive rents for apartments and houses in Seattle for shippard workers will be made by the Fair Rentals Commission of the United States Emergency Fleet Corporation, which Friday night ordered rentals lowered on seventeen complaints brought before the commission. More than 175 cases have been investigated by the commission since its organization in September, and 100 landlards have responded to questionnaires.

Authority to regulate rentals was vested in the Emergency Fleet Corporation when it was given the power by Congress on March 1, 1918, to house shippard workers, commandeering private property, if necessary, to provide shelter for the workers and their families. In case landlords are indisposed to lower their rentals, as ordered to do by the shipping board, their property may be commandeered. To the present, however, Seattle landlords have cooperated in all possible ways with the Emergency Corporation and have expressed perfect willingness to abide by the findings of the Fair Rentals Commission, said the commissioners yesterday.

Many complaints have been lodged with the commission, and investigations are being carried on every day. So great has the work grown in the month and a half since the commission was created, that the board will probably be greatly enlarged very soon, to care for the heavy work.



Spring vetch will do just as well, it can be planted as late as December 1, but the sooner it is in now the better."

He carefully made a pile of corn stalks, pea, bean and potato vines mixed with earth and shaped it carefully into a mount about seven feet long and three feet wide, and put a border of lime around the mound to make it attract attention.
