- Washington Pulp and Paper Foundation Scholarship:**

Students who have completed the online application through the College of Engineering need only complete Sections A and F, AND the attached WPPF Scholarship application. **Applicants are strongly encouraged to apply prior to February 15th.**

B. Educational History

Freshmen: Please submit all high school transcripts and a copy of your SAT or other test scores. You may apply with minimal pre-science/pre-engineering coursework.

Current UW or Transfer Students: Please submit all college transcripts. Junior level applicants should have completed the calculus series, chemistry and English composition. NOTE: You may still be admitted with only partial coursework completed.

C. Employment/Volunteer History (if applicable)

Please attach a list of employers and/or organizations for which you have either been employed or have volunteered. Include the position held, the dates of your service, and the number of hours worked per week.

D. Honors and Activities

Please attach a list of school, work or community honors and activities. Please indicate your most significant contribution, the organization name (if appropriate), and dates of service/award.

E. Personal Statement

Attach a succinct, typed, one-page personal statement that will give the Paper Science and Engineering admissions committee a better understanding of your background. Your personal statement must include:

- reasons for choosing Paper Science and Engineering;
- and your career objectives.

You may also include other factors such as personal, family, economic or educational circumstances. If you complete your statement on a separate sheet, please be sure to include your name.

F. Applicant Certification and Checklist

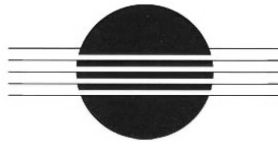

Scholarship Application

As scholarships are awarded in mid-February, applicants are strongly encouraged to apply prior to February 15th.

The Washington Pulp and Paper Foundation (WPPF) provides scholarships to students enrolled at the University of Washington in the Paper Science and Engineering program. Academic merit and leadership potential are primary considerations for scholarships; financial need is also a factor for several scholarships. The scholarship process is competitive.

To be eligible to receive a scholarship:

- You must be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States or sponsored by a member of the WPPF.
- You must apply and be accepted to the University of Washington. You are responsible for applying for admission. (See www.admit.washington.edu for undergraduate admissions information.)
- You must apply and be accepted to the Paper Science and Engineering major through the College of Forest Resources. You are responsible for applying to the major (see pages 1-2 of this application packet).
- You must have taken pre-science/pre-engineering coursework.

To be considered, please complete and submit the following:

1. An essay of approximately 250 words on one of the following topics:

- A. In what specific ways can a scientist or engineer approach the problem of conserving our limited energy or natural resources?
- B. What specific problems are most challenging to you as a future scientist or engineer and how would your solutions benefit society?
- C. How did you become interested in science or engineering? What is a scientist or engineer, and in what way does his/her work benefit society?

2. Two or more letters of recommendation from persons (outside of your family) who are directly familiar with your education, qualifications, and interests. We suggest including at least one letter from a teacher or principal.

3. Counselor/Principal Certification Section (for high school applicants only):
