Scholarship Application

- ✓ Form available from WPPF or you may down-load from:
<http://depts.washington.edu/wppf>
- ✓ We suggest applying by mid-February for a scholarship award for Autumn '09.
- ✓ Apply for financial aid through UW if applicable. Several WPPF scholarships are need-based.

Eligibility

- ✓ PSE or PSE-ChemE major
- ✓ US citizen or permanent resident status

Scholarship Duration

- ✓ Renewable year-to-year until graduation (12 terms for freshmen earning PSE degree; 3 added terms for ChemE degree).

Scholarship Dependencies

- ✓ Academic performance: 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA at UW
- ✓ Staying on the PSE or PSE-ChemE academic curricula
- ✓ WPPF resources

Scholarship Amounts

- ✓ Vary according to academic performance and year in the program.
- ✓ Full-tuition incentive scholarships are awarded to selected first year students in the College of Forest Resources (CFR). These scholarships transition to WPPF scholarships for subsequent years.
- ✓ Scholarship amounts are periodically adjusted to keep up with tuition increases.

Scholarship Award Notes

- ✓ Amounts apply to the **2009-2010 academic year**.
- ✓ UW tuition plus fees is ~\$7,200 for the above academic year (resident students).
- ✓ Scholarship awards for transfer students reflect the student's year in the PSE curriculum.
- ✓ Transfer students are eligible for the incentive scholarship for their first year.
- ✓ The above awards provide from 50% to 90% of resident tuition plus fees.

Intern and Co-op Experiences

- ✓ Intern and co-op positions provide practical experience, bring relevancy to classroom learning and often lead to careers.
- ✓ PSE students are expected to have a minimum of one internship (3 months).
- ✓ Many students have 6 to 12 months of intern and co-op experiences.
- ✓ Compensation ranges from \$2,500 to \$4,000 per month.
- ✓ Typical total earnings are \$10,000 to \$20,000 while in college.
