




Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners (ARNPs)

The advanced registered nurse practitioner (ARNP) license category in Washington includes:

- Certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNAs).
- Certified nurse midwives (CNMs).
- Nurse practitioners (NPs).
- Clinical nurse specialists (CNSs).

In Washington State, ARNPs must also hold active registered nurse licenses. The following Washington statistics were calculated based on data from the ARNP license files, which contain licensee name, mailing address, birthdate, and gender.



Number of ARNPs with Washington Licenses and Washington Addresses from 2004 to 2016





ARNP Age and Gender


Average Age of ARNPs in Washington



Percent of ARNPs Who Are Male in Washington




ARNPs by Age Group in Washington



General Washington population data are from the Washington State Office of Financial Management and are updated April 1 of each year (<http://www.ofm.wa.gov/pop/april1/>).

The urban-rural location of each ARNP was determined using their license ZIP code and the Rural-Urban Commuting Area Codes 3.1.
