

This one-year fellowship offers our trainees the opportunity to work with a vibrant and diverse team of health care providers, manage common and complex injuries in the office and on the playing field, gain expertise in musculoskeletal ultrasound, and receive mentorship in completing a scholarly project with leading researchers in the field. Each fellow assumes the role of head team physician a local high school, serves as medical co-director for the Seattle Marathon, and plays an integral role on the medical team providing care to varsity student-athletes at the University of Washington.

The University of Washington participates in the NRMP Primary Care Sports Medicine Matching Program.

The University of Washington only considers applicants with training in family medicine.



Minimum Screening Requirements

Applications will only be considered for interviews after their ERAS application, personal statement and three letters of recommendation have been received.

Special Instructions

The following list of items is expected to be included as part of your application:

- Completed ERAS Application
- 3 letters of recommendation (1 from your residency's program director)
- Curriculum vitae
- Personal statement
- Copy of USMLE/COMLEX transcript
- Copy of medical school diploma & transcript

Optional supportive items

The following items may be reviewed, but are not considered mandatory, and include:

- Medical school dean's letter
- Additional letters of recommendation
- Resident rotation schedule
- Certificate or other validation of all previous training
- Copy of current state medical licensure

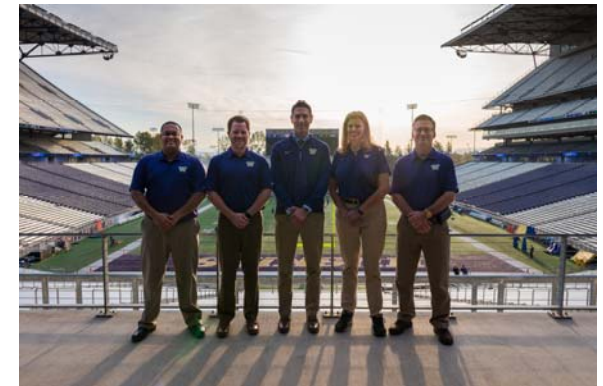
