Grading Criteria (2016-17 Academic Year)

The Family Medicine Clerkship Student Clinical Evaluation is composed of eleven scoring categories:

- Knowledge of Subject
- Data-Gathering Skills
- Clinical Skills
- Patient-Centered Care Skills
- Management Skills
- Integration Skills

- Communication Skills
- Relationships with Patients
- Professional Relationships
- Dependability and Responsibility
- Educational Attitudes

Each category will have a score of 1 to 5 and a GPA will be calculated based on aggregate of the scores.

Clinical Honors: GPA of 4.9 to 5.0
Clinical High Pass: GPA of 4.2 to 4.8
Clinical Pass: GPA of 2.8 to 4.1

4. **Clinical Fail:** GPA of less than 2.8 OR a score of 1 in any category

For the 2016-17 school year the final exam scores will be interpreted as follows:
