Site Details:

The main facility is Kootenai Clinic Family Medicine Coeur d'Alene Residency. Student will spend 80% of his/her time at the clinic and 20% at Kootenai Health, the hospital. Site Director is Dr. Jonathan Shupe. On sight psychiatrist and PharmD residents enhance full spectrum training and patient care. Medical students will be working with both faculty and residents during clinic sessions.

Hospital experience will include inpatient service including initial intake of new admissions with follow up care both as inpatient and outpatient. Medical students will be involved in training in EKG interpretation, radiology studies as part of the inpatient curriculum for residents.

Community:

Coeur d'Alene is the largest city in northern Idaho Panhandle. The city is situated on the north shore of Lake Coeur d'Alene, 25-mile (40 km) in length. Locally, Coeur d'Alene is known as the "Lake City," or simply called by its initials: "CDA". Coeur d'Alene is a resort town, with the Coeur d'Alene Resort taking up a prominent portion of the city's downtown. It is also located near two major ski resorts, with Silver Mountain Resort to the east in Kellogg, and Schweitzer Mountain Ski Resort to the north in Sandpoint.

Common Clinic Patients:

Outpatient clinic care involves full spectrum family medicine, with prenatal and preventative medicine as well as caring for pregnant women with substance abuse issues.

On-Call Duties:

Medical students will round with residents and attending's when on service and be on call once per week.

Housing/Transportation:

Housing is shared with other medical students. Pets are not allowed. Housing is not available for families. Students must provide their own vehicle. No public transportation nearby, though the clinic and hospital are within walking/biking distance. A bike trail runs along the complex and can take students to the clinic or hospital.

Housing Description:

Address: 4580 West Greenchain, Loop #4 Coeur d'Alene ID 83814. The apartment has microwave, dishwasher, refrigerator, internet, silverware, TV, oven, desk, towels, dinnerware, bedding 3 bedroom units with 2 baths (shared units with other med students). It is not ADA compliant, NOT suitable for families, NO pets. The clinic is 10 minutes from housing via bike or walking and no transportation is provided. Students must bring own vehicle as public transportation is not easily accessible.

Dress Code:

The basic objective of the clerkship is to give you first-person experience in being a family physician in the community. The best way to get this experience is to emulate the physicians with whom you work. The usual attire for physicians in our facility is slacks and a button up shirt for males and for females is slacks/skirt/dress and blouse or a professional attire dress. It is required that you wear your provided nametag while working with our patients either in the clinic or at the hospital. Our patients have been told that students will be involved in their care.
