FAMILY MEDICINE CLERKSHIP Grading Criteria 2018-19

Clinical Grading Criteria

1. Honors (GPA of 4.9 to 5.0)

Students must receive at least 10 of 11 scores of 5 and no score less than a 4 in any category for Honors. This equates to a GPA of 4.9 or higher.

2. High Pass (GPA of 4.2 to 4.8)

Students must earn a GPA of 4.2 or higher to earn a grade of High Pass. There are multiple ways of doing so (please download the Clinical Grading Workbook to determine grades necessary to earn High Pass).

3. Pass (GPA of 2.8 to 4.1)

Students earning a GPA of 2.8 to 4.1 will earn a grade of Pass.

4. Fail (GPA of less than 2.8 OR a score of 1 in any category)

A failing grade is based on student's performance taken as a whole and not solely based on any one numeric profile. A 1 in any category will result in a failure.

Final Exam Grading Criteria

- 1. **Honors:** 82 percent and above = Grade adjustment: +0.1
- 2. **High Pass:** 75 to 81.9 percent = Grade adjustment: No adjustment
- 3. **Pass:** 55 to 74.9 percent = Grade adjustment: -0.2
- 4. **Fail:** Less than 55 percent = Failed clerkship

Final Grade Grading Criteria

The Final Grade is a combination of the Clinical Grade and the grade adjustment of the Final Exam Grade.

- Honors: GPA of 4.9 to 5.1
 High Pass: GPA of 4.2 to 4.8
- 3. **Pass:** GPA of 2.6 to 4.1
- 4. Fail: GPA of less than 2.6 OR a score of 1 in any category
