1 Title: RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE OFFICE 2 **OF VETERAN LIFE** 3 4 Sponsored by: Brandon Ray 5 Written by: Brandon Ray 6 Resolution Number: 07.14-15 7 8 WHEREAS University policy is to promote diversity on campus; and 9 10 WHEREAS at the start of the 2014-2015 school year, there were over 400 veterans, 71 active duty service members, 36 National Guard, 52 reservists, and 1,000 military 11 12 dependents that were students on the Seattle campus¹; and 13 14 WHEREAS veteran (including active duty military, reservist, and National Guard) 15 students, staff, and faculty are an important part of campus diversity; and 16 17 WHEREAS the United States Veterans Administration developed the Post-9/11 GI Bill, 18 that likely will continue to draw veterans and their dependents to the University of 19 Washington for the foreseeable future; and 20 21 WHEREAS the University of Washington Office of External Affairs recently conducted 22 a study on veterans' services, in which the Office concluded that the inability to easily 23 connect people, resources and information on veterans' issues limits the potential support 24 the UW has to offer them²; and 25 26 WHEREAS the University of Washington Veterans Center is designed to provide 27 students with information about VA educational benefits, certify GI Bill benefits, and 28 answer questions about financial aid³; and 29 30 WHEREAS no centralized organization exists on the University of Washington campus 31 to provide non-financial resources to meet the veteran community's needs; and 32 33 WHEREAS other highly regarded universities in the United States, such as Arizona 34 State, Ohio State, Michigan State, Texas A&M, University of California – Los Angeles, 35 and University of Maryland, all have campus veteran resource centers; and 36 37 WHEREAS the Office of External Affairs study recommends that a new position be 38 created for a Veterans and Military Affairs Coordinator, who would be tasked with 39 coordination, outreach, and community building⁴; and 40 41 WHEREAS members of the registered student organization, Husky United Military 42 Veterans, have submitted unit application documentation requesting funding for a veteran
