

Defining Disability

- For the purposes of this research, a disability is any condition which society defines as making it more difficult to have a fulfilling life. This could include physical (e.g., impaired mobility), mental/emotional (e.g., depression, social anxiety disorders), learning (e.g., ADHD, dyslexia), chronic (e.g., autoimmune disorders), behavioral(e.g., addiction), sensory (e.g., visual, hearing, tactile) or other conditions."
- The ADA defines a person with a disability as a person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activity. This includes people who have a record of such an impairment, even if they do not currently have a disability.

Accommodations

 are technology, services, and changes in policy, procedures, and the built environment that enable individuals with disabilities to perform essential functions or to equally participate in events and programs.

Accommodations Include....

- Adjusting or modifying examinations, training materials, or policies;
- Providing readers and interpreters
- Making the service site readily accessible to and usable by people with disabilities.
- Examples include more time to take tests, extended due dates, scanned books, transcription of lecture, etc.



Projected Additional Revenue


