

Program Reviews:

How to make an impact as a student

What are Program Reviews?	All academic units must go through a program review at least every 10 years, which are conducted jointly with The Graduate School and Provost in cooperation with the relevant School or College. Find out more at grad.uw.edu/program-review .
Why you should care	Program information and feedback gathered during Program Reviews directly impact the future of the program. Program Reviews can affect student admission, program structure, graduate funding, and program retention.
Attend the Site Visit!	The most important impact you can make is to attend the Program Review Site Visit! Share your feedback on your program and provide ways for your program to improve. The following tips will help you enhance your student voice during the Site Visit.
Contact your GPA	Connect with your Graduate Program Advisor to find out when the Program Review Committee will be meeting with students during the Site Visit.
Connect with your GPSS Senators + student organization	Connect with your GPSS Senators and student organization leadership to get the word out about the upcoming Program Review and Site Visit.
Gather input from fellow students	Gather shared input from students and recent alumni before the Site Visit and mutually create feedback for the program. Work with the student leadership to host coffee hours to get input from fellow students. You can also post on your program's social media pages to get input from more students. This will help prepare a collective student voice to share feedback at the Site Visit.
Come to GPSS Office Hours	Come to GPSS Office Hours and meet with the Vice President of Internal Affairs to ask questions and learn more information about how to share student voice during your program's review. Reach out to gpssvpin@uw.edu for more info.




