MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR AD HOC COMMITTEE FOR ALTERNATIVE EMERGENCY SERVICES BILL

Purpose

At the December 8, 2021 GPSS meeting, the Senate body unanimously voted to create the Ad Hoc Committee for Alternative Emergency Services (AEmS) Bill. This committee will address the comments, questions, and concerns raised by GPSS officers and senators. The AEmS Ad Hoc Committee will be a place for the community to be heard and a space where the voices of those most impacted by alternative emergency services will be centered.

Governance

This agreement establishes the Ad Hoc Committee shall be composed of the following voting representatives:

- GPSS Vice President of Internal Affairs (designated officer for committee oversight)
- Original Bill Authors
- GPSS Senators

ASUW representatives, students at-large, and community and campus partners do not have voting privileges within the Ad Hoc Committee.

The Ad Hoc Committee will be tasked with the revision of the original bill, along with revisiting the scope of the bill's purpose, including but not limited to consultation with relevant stakeholders such as student groups, campus entities, and city representatives.

Timeline & Termination Conditions

- The Committee will commence at its first public meeting, January 21, 2022.
- The Committee will meet as needed to discuss changes to language in the bill.
- A representative from the Ad Hoc committee will report to the Executive Committee on the bill's progress monthly.

Bill sponsors will present revised language of the bill to the GPSS body after a Committee vote. Passage of the bill will dissolve the Ad Hoc Committee.

This agreement may be amended from time to time via Executive Committee vote.
