

2023 Three-Minute Thesis (3MT) Competition



People's Choice Prize | \$1,000: Megan Maerz, doctoral student in Molecular Medicine & Mechanisms of Disease





THE PROBLEM

Executive plan has several equity issues Potential to cause senate avoidable problems.

Let's discuss some of the potential issues

SENATE HAS A "BODY" PROBLEM

Senate struggling & failing to maintain adequate representation for graduate students

Low senate numbers - Re, current number of senators, viz-a-viz number of senators we should have.

Committees struggle to recruit and retain senators on committees.

Judicial: several attempts to form the committee

Still struggles to meet quorum for meetings & votes

Executive Plan Poses Equity Issues

Inequitable to pay one person on a committee & forego others for same bylaws duties (perspective as both Chair and member)

Elevates one committee member above other committee members.

Appearance of favoritism among "peers."

Could lead to unnecessary competition and rivalry.

Paid Member could feel indebted to executive that fought for pay.

Could create division within committees


Unscrupulous Officer can take advantage for undue influence on committee through Chair. NOTE ROLES FOR ELECTIONS

WHAT WE SHOULD DO INSTEAD

Senate should incentivize more (NOT LESS) people for committee work, NOT create issues,
