- > Winter Quarter
 - Week 1 Week 5
 - > Officers prepare budget proposals
 - > Submit budget proposals to Exec and F&B committees
 - Week 6 10
 - Exec and F&B review proposals and submit recommendations to Senate

> Spring Quarter

- Senate reviews both recommendations from Exec and F&B
 - > May be different from each other
- **Senate** can make amendments by 2/3 majority vote
- **Senate** must approve budget by each heading
