Resolution to Amend the UPASS Advisory Board MOU

WHEREAS the Seattle Student Universal U-PASS Advisory Board passed R-13-6 A Resolution to Set U-PASS fee at \$70; and

WHEREAS GPSS is required to approve fee recommendations made by the Universal U-PASS Program Advisory Board pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding Regarding a Universal Student U-PASS (MOU), entered into by ASUW, GPSS, and the University of Washington.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENT SENATE:

THAT the U-PASS fee be decreased to \$70/quarter starting Fall quarter 2024 and the MOU 'Fee Amount' be amended to read:

- 'In Fall 2024, and for the following three quarters, the amount of the fee shall be \$70 per academic quarter unless otherwise amended by the process outlined below.
- After Summer 2024 the fee amount may change. Implementation of any changes to the fee shall follow the process outlined below.'; and

- Attend all regular GPSS Meetings (3-5 per quarter)
- Attend all Executive Committee Meetings (3-5 per quarter, including summers)
- Choose your own adventure for getting more involved in GPSS—Chair a GPSS committee, form an ad hoc committee, sponsor and/or author resolutions, volunteer to assist with events, serve as an appointee on a University committee, etc.

Executive Senators terms are two (2) years or until graduation, whichever comes first. They act as a crucial form of checks and balances, representing the Senate itself on the Executive Committee. They receive monetary recognition for their extra time commitments and responsibilities in the amount of \$450 per quarter (Fall, Winter, and Spring), disbursed at the end of each academic year.

https://forms.office.com/r/hKSqbhgRYN (Word of the Day: U-PASS) The Executive Committee (EC) discussed and voted on recommendations with regard to the vacancy of the VP of Finance position for Spring 2024 were at the 4/10/24 GPSS Executive Committee meeting following the resignation of the VP of Finance on 3/29/24. The EC recommendations are as follows:

<u>Recommendation 1.</u>) Suspend Article V, Section I, Clause 5 of the GPSS Bylaws regarding Officer resignation and replacement for Spring Quarter 2024; [note: Suspensions of Bylaws require a 2/3 majority vote of the Senate to pass); and

Recommendation 2.) Since the President, Vice President External Affairs, and Budget Specialist, will be able to complete the remaining tasks of the VP of Finance for the 2024 academic year between them, the EC recommends that we forego a Special Election to replace the VP of Finance for Spring 2024, opting instead to recoup some of these personnel costs towards next year's budget [note: the passing of this recommendation requires a simple majority vote of the Senate and is contingent on Recommendation 1 receiving the necessary 2/3 majority vote); and

<u>Recommendation 3.</u>) Increase the Budget Specialist's hours from fifteen (15) hours per week to nineteen (19) hours per week to help support the President and Vice President of External Affairs in the financial responsibilities for Spring.
