Spotlight on Barbara Baquero Core Investigator, HPRC Affiliate Faculty, Latino Center for Health

New faculty member Barbara Baquero comes to HPRC, the Latino Center for Health, and the UW with a research background in designing community-based interventions to reduce health disparities. She teaches HSERV 514: Social Determinants of Population Health and Health Disparities. Barbara shared with us some of her background and her thoughts about the work she does.

How do you think your early life and education influenced your career path?

My earlier life experiences with my family and community have informed and nurtured my education and career choices. Community engagement and involvement were always part of our family life. These experiences led me to study psychology as an undergraduate; I became interested in human behavior and how people interact with their communities. Public health, combining these interests, became the perfect career—and my passion.

What do you see as the importance of health promotion and health disparities research?

Health promotion and health disparities research are critical to the health of the nation. These fields of research should lead the movement to address and change structural factors, in order to eliminate barriers to health equity and support the opportunity of health for all.

What would you like to achieve with your work?

I would like my research findings and products to inform interventions that reduce health disparities for Latinos and other disadvantaged groups. But mostly I would like to produce work that shows what health equity looks like, while training communities and professionals to continue the work.

What do you like to do in your "free time" - away from work?

I like to be outdoors, enjoying the sun, and now, in the Pacific Northwest, the mountains and ocean. Free time means exploring new places, trying new foods, and going for hikes with my husband and our dog Tamal.
