HPRC researchers have been working on the formative, first year tasks of PEARLS Equity, the core research project for HPRC as a CDC Prevention Research Center member. And with PEARLS $Connect, researchers \ have \ been \ conducting \ surveys \ and \ qualitative \ interviews \ to \ assess \ what$ impact PEARLS has on social isolation, as well as older adults' use of health services or transitions to nursing homes.
