New Training Available and More Resources to Come

In a collaborative effort to increase vaccination rates, the Partnership for Vaccine Confidence team is offering a free training for bilingual and multilingual community members to learn how they can share accurate COVID-19 health information with their language communities and help save lives.

The training includes specific tips and resources for communicating effectively, better understanding how to find accessible health care services, finding and sharing up-to-date and accurate COVID-19 information, and taking action by advocating for COVID-19 safety in the community.

Students, school staff, community health workers, community organizations, medical interpreters, and/or community advocates, among other key community roles, are encouraged to take the training and become a COVID-19 Information Navigator for their language communities.

We also want our partnering organizations and their communities to have the resources they need to share accurate and easy to understand COVID-19 information. To help make this possible, we are creating toolkits to support organizations. One toolkit will be for communicating about COVID-19 vaccines through social media, radio scripts, and printable materials. The other will be a workplace wellness toolkit about epidemics from our Connect to Wellness program for employers and business owners.
