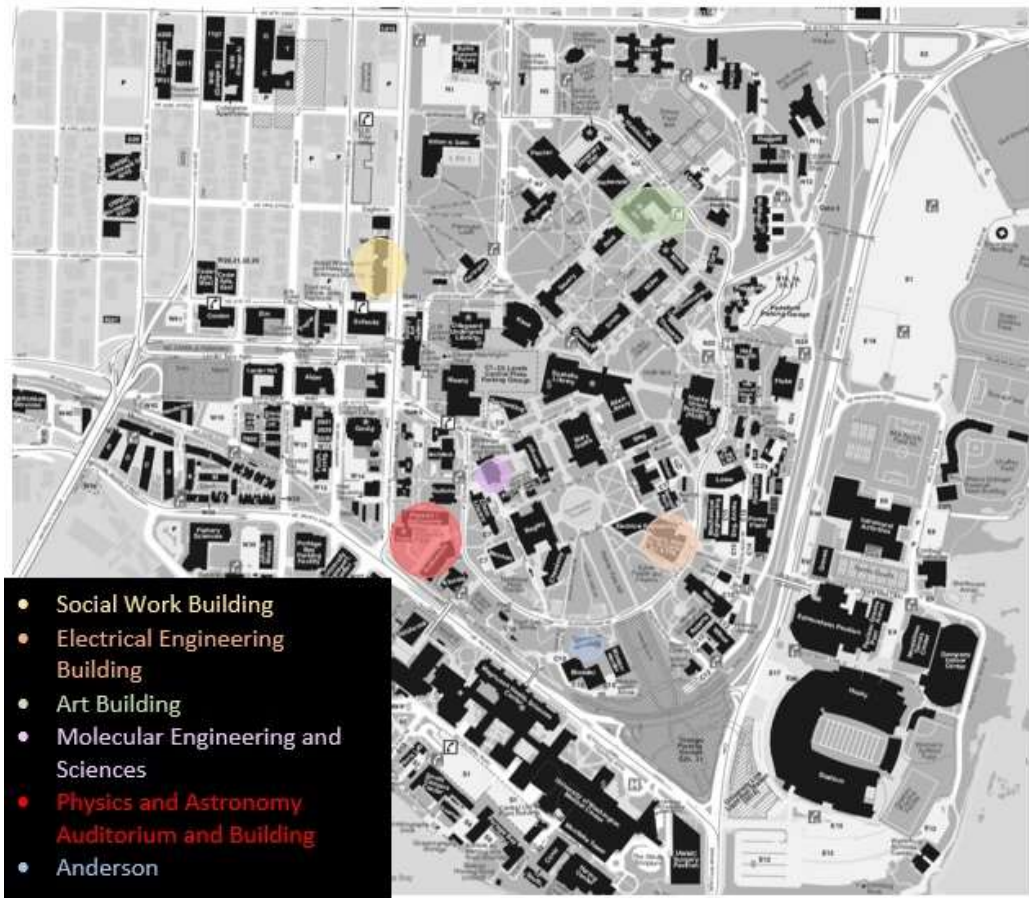






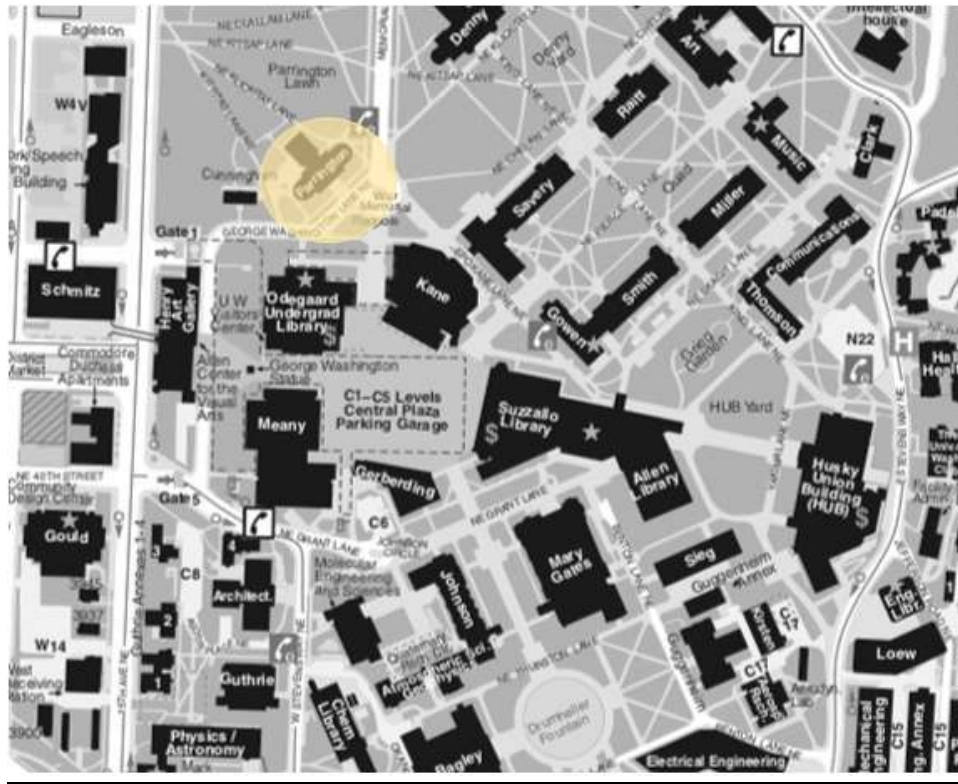
## Study Spaces Around Campus

## How to Get to Study Area



1. Enter in one of the three entrances (marked with yellow arrows)
  - Two entrances on intersection of 41<sup>st</sup> and 15
    - i. Entrance to 1<sup>st</sup> floor has stairs up to entrance
    - ii. Entrance to basement is ground level of street
  - One entrance between Social Work Building and Speech and Hearing Clinic to 1<sup>st</sup> floor
2. Take elevator or stairs to 2<sup>nd</sup> floor
3. When exiting staircase or elevator turn left and study center will be access through a door

Negatives of Study Area

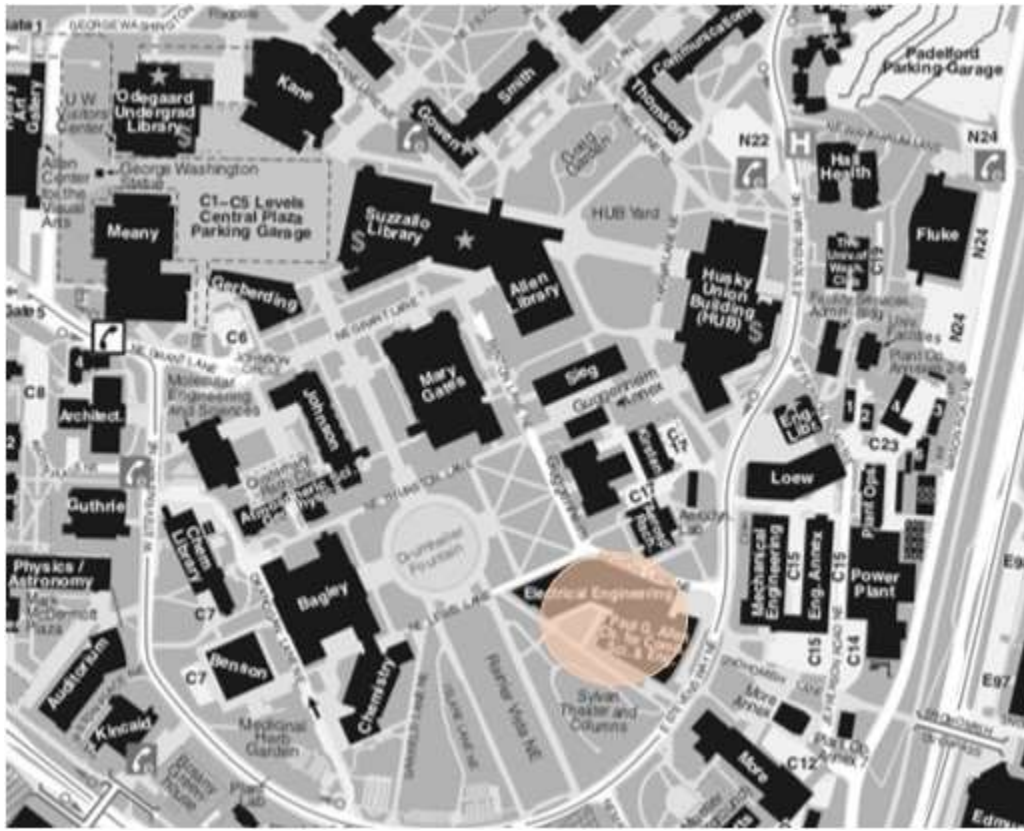
- A little harder to access

- Vending Machines



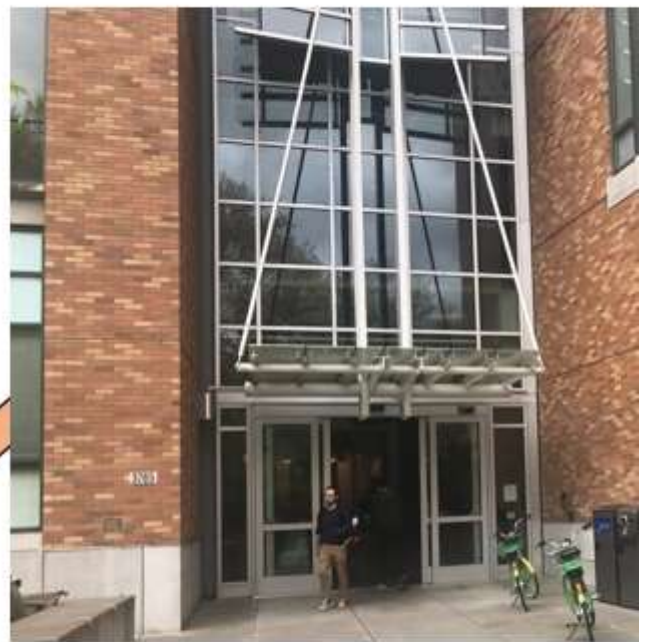
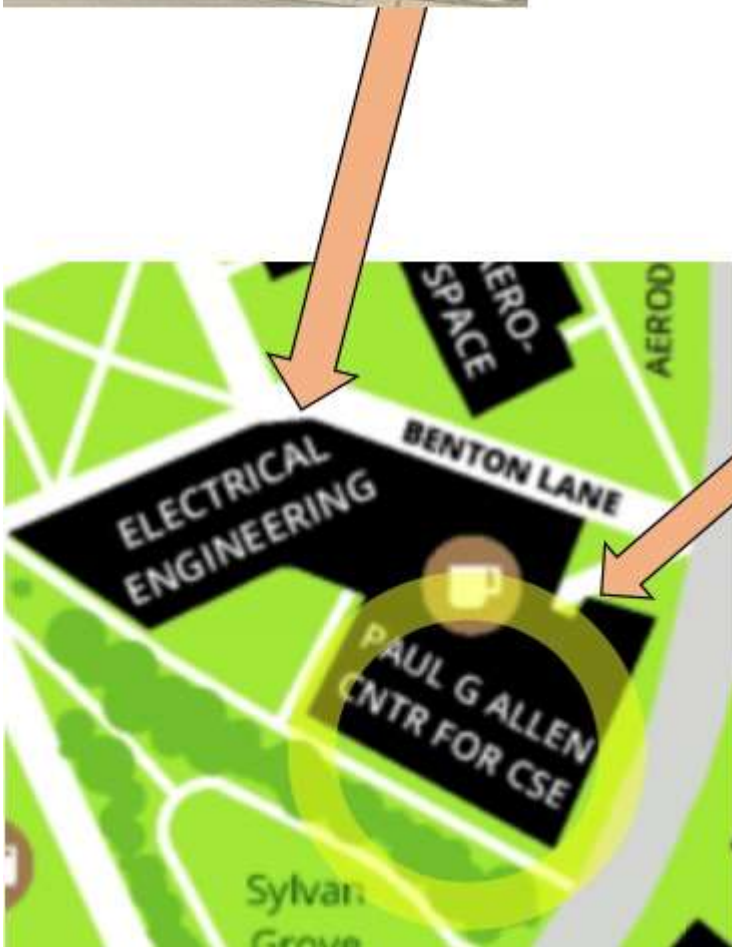
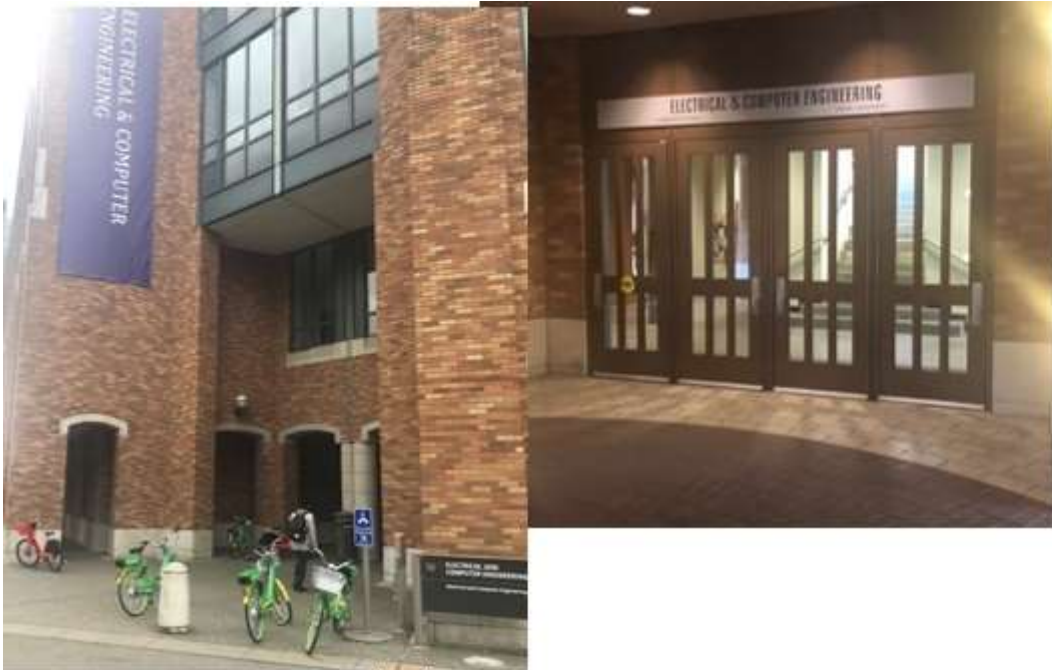

## Ground Floor Features



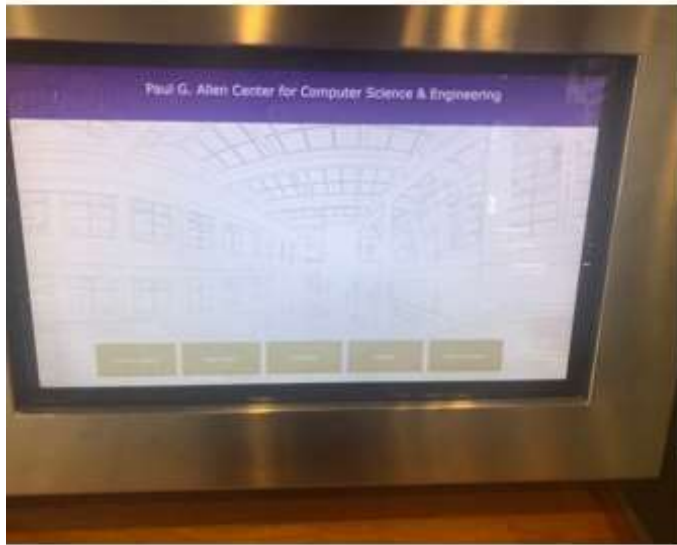
### Positives

- Great setting for studying or meeting with other students

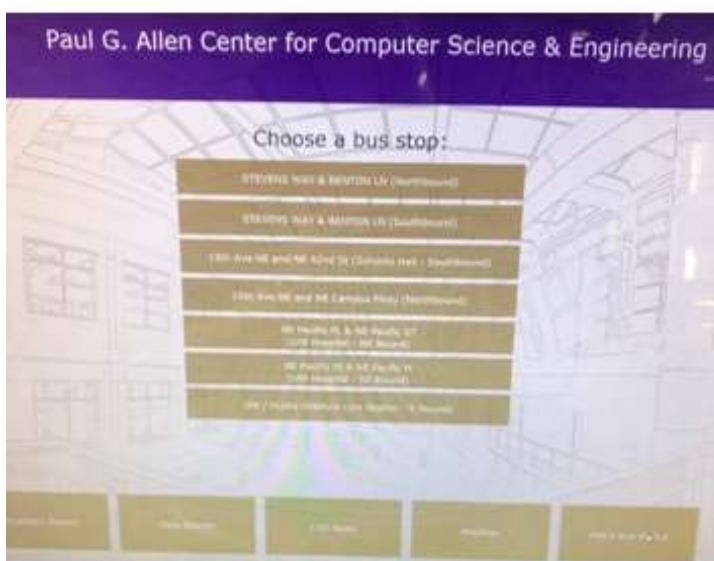
### Negatives

### Positives

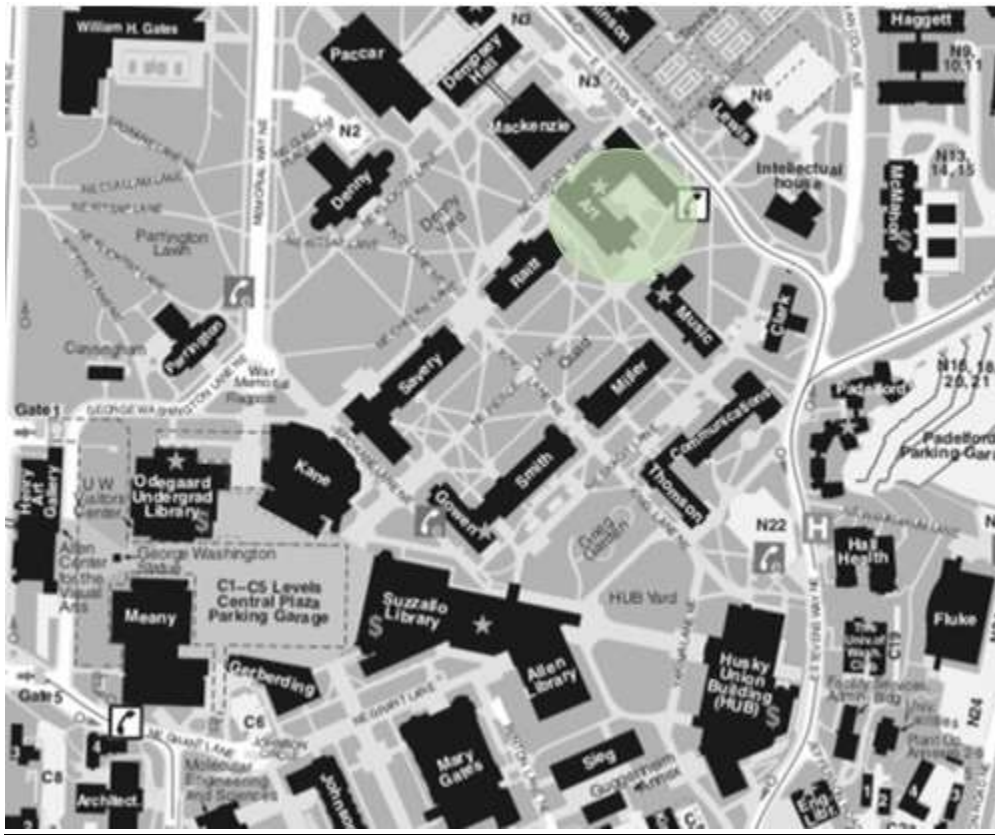
- Typically Quiet

### Negatives

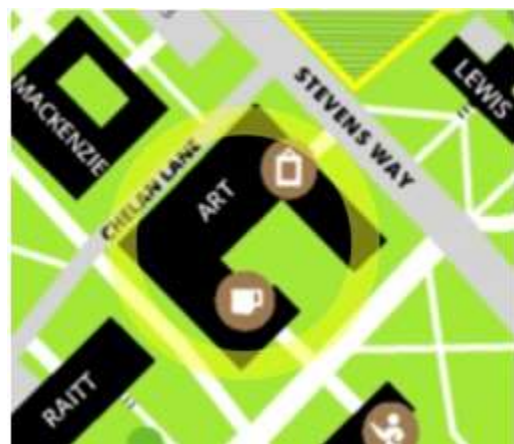
- Some floors are where certain office hours are held (not all)

West Entrance

### Location

- Quad or in front of Paccar Lawn
- Stairs
- No Wheel Entrance here

### How To get to Study Center

1. Enter through doors
2. Stair Case entrance is immediately to the left through a door to the basement
3. Exit Staircase and walk to the left down the hallway
4. Study center will be to the left with doors wide open

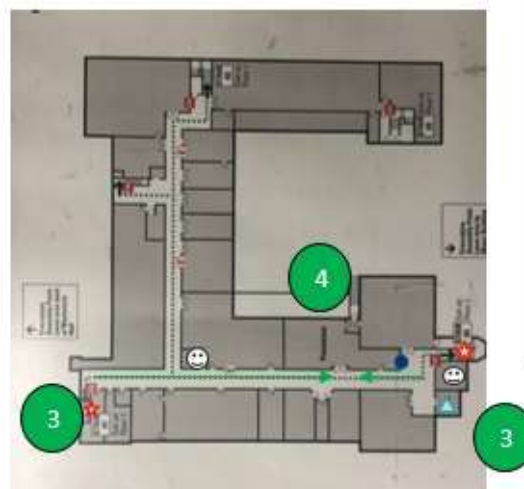
East Entrance

### Location

- Stairs and Ramp North Quad entrance
- Ramp and Stairs at Entrance

### How to get to Study Center

1. Enter through doors
2. If taking stairs, entrance is through last set of doors immediately to the right. If taking elevator, it will be to the right
3. Take stairs or elevator down to basement and there will be a hallway, walk straight
4. Study center will be to the right with doors wide open

- Variety of seats and tables

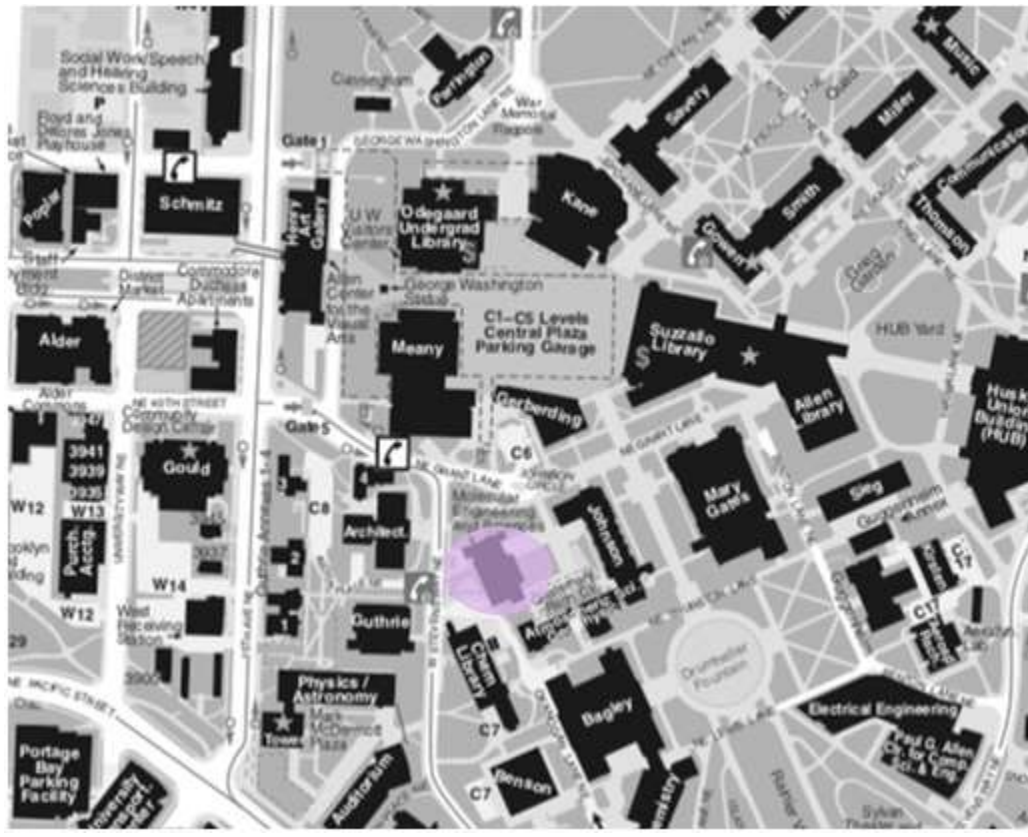


## Negatives

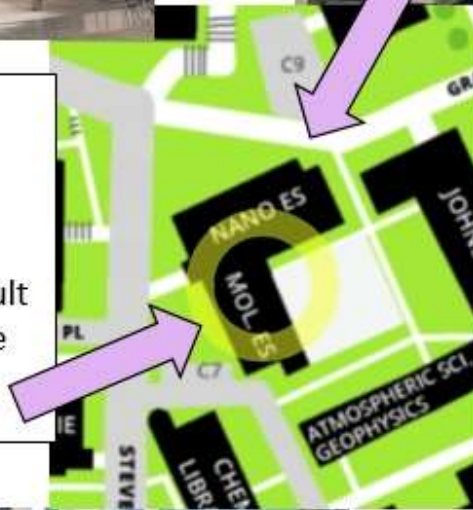

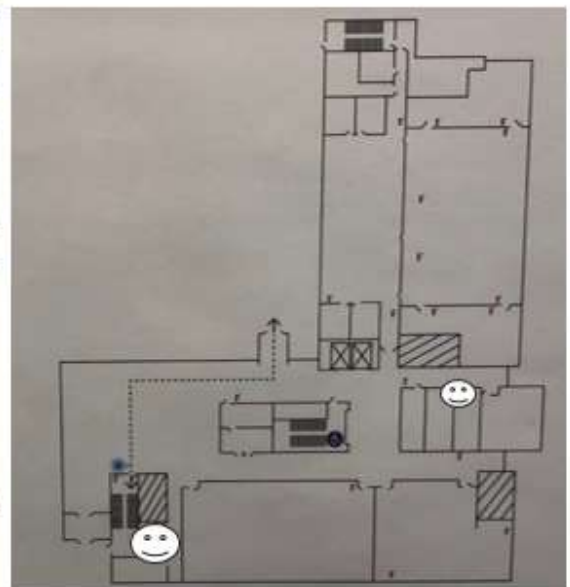
## Entrance to Study Center

### Positives

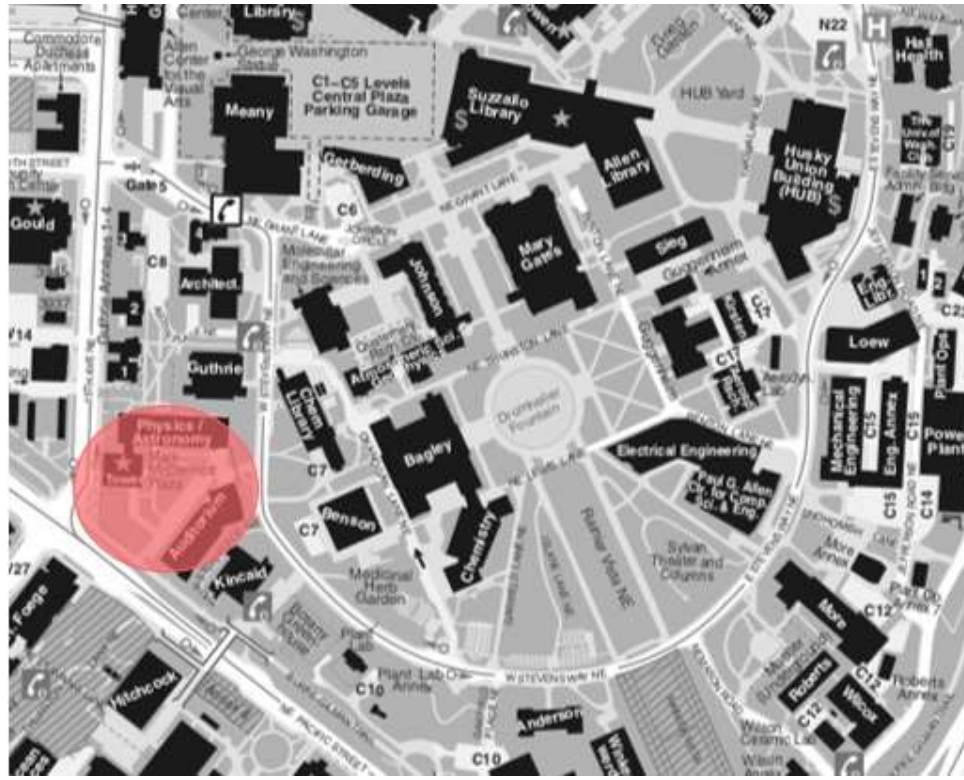
- Easy to access

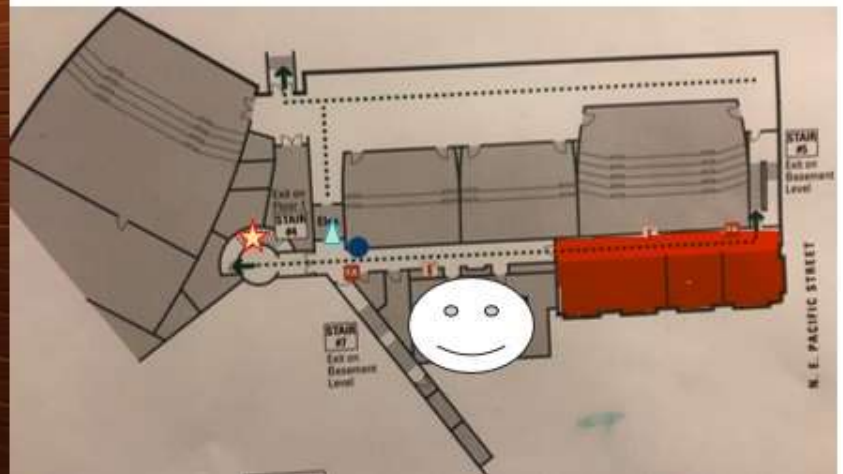
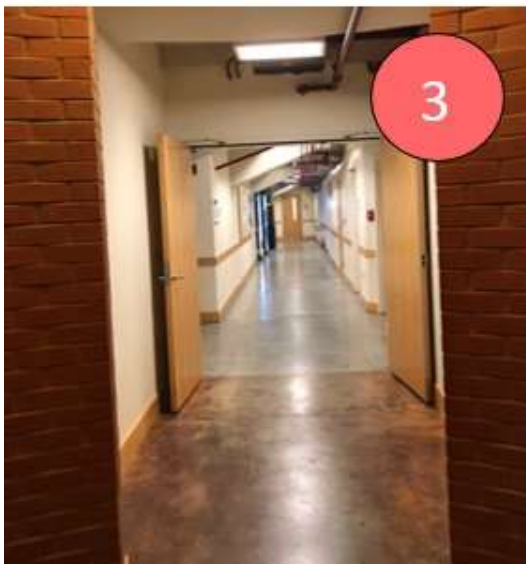




Physics Auditorium



1. Enter the Auditorium Building

## Positives

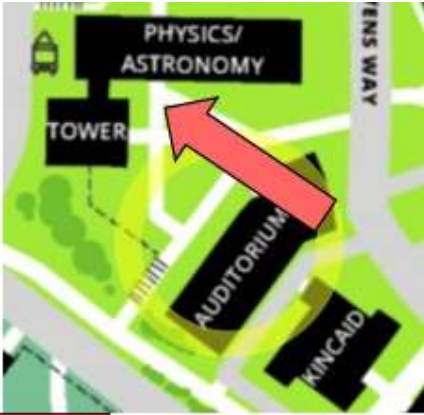
- A lot of seats

- Near bus stops on 15<sup>th</sup>

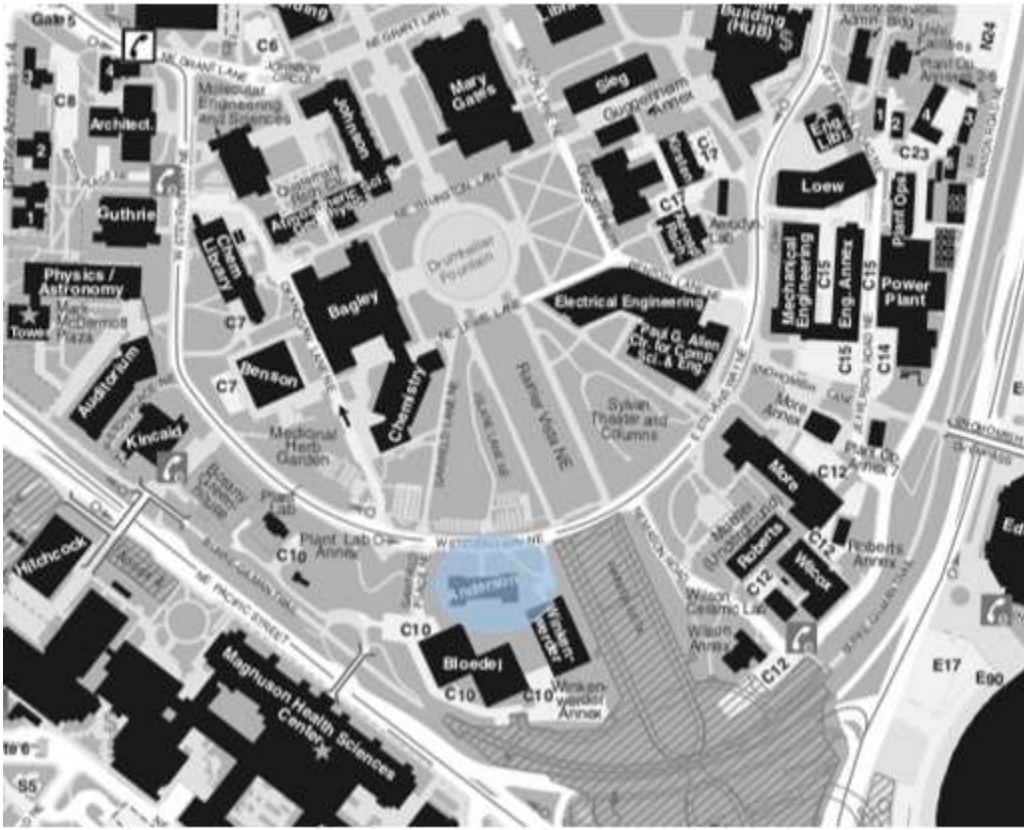


Negatives

1. Enter building, only one entrance
