


Study Spaces Around Campus

How to Get to Study Area



- 1. Enter in one of the three entranced (marked with yellow arrows
 - Two entrances on intersection of 41st and 15
 - i. Entrance to 1st floor has stairs up to entrance
 - ii. Entrance to basement is ground level of street
 - One entrance between Social Work Building and Speech and Hearing Clinic to 1st floor
- 2. Take elevator or stairs to 2nd floor
- 3. When exiting staircase or elevator turn left and study center will be access through a door



- Vending Machines








Negatives of Study Area






Positives

- One type of seating








- Outlooks to charge phone and computer

- Elevators and stairs to access






Positives

Location







Physics Auditorium and Building






Physics Auditorium


- A lot of seats






