



# A Survey of Obstetric and Gynecology Resident Experience and Interest in Global Health

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## Background

The Department of Global Health at the University of Washington (UW) is focusing on enhancing sustainable health care in low income countries (LICs) through the integration of education, research, and service in coordination with other academic departments.

Electives in LIC's offer residents unique opportunities

- > to broaden their clinical and surgical skills
- > to increase their global awareness of health care inequality.<sup>1</sup>
- > Young physicians exposed to global health during residency may be more apt to continue international work during their careers.<sup>2,3</sup>

## Discussion

Our survey demonstrates that many of the UW residents have prior international experience in medical settings

- > strong interest to continue serving
- > valuable language skills
- > desire to contribute their personal time toward an international experience.

## Resident Interests and Preferences

All respondents were interested in international work in their careers, and the majority would do it if it were available to them as a resident. The ideal duration for most was 4-6 weeks long and the greatest percentage would prefer a Latin American country. Most would prefer to have supporting to moderate supervision, and many would be willing to forfeit one week of their vacation to serve abroad.

We believe these results indicate that our residents would overwhelmingly participate if international rotations with appropriate supervision are made available.

## Second Language

Over half state that they speak a second language, with Spanish the most prevalent. Almost half claim fluency in that language.

## Prior International Experience

The majority of residents have participated in international work. Most served for greater than a month while in medical school and the majority worked in a Latin American country.
