Approval of Agenda

Discussion

1. Health Fee Updates

Haley explained that the Health Fee will be split 20-40-40. 20% for LiveWell, 40% for the Counseling Center, and Husky Health Center.

- **Aiden** added that this was not the original split
- **Tammy** wanted to know what the previous split was
- **Haley** said LiveWell gets \$200,000 from SAF, the Counseling Center gets around 2 million, and Husky Health gets \$7 million

Haley gave updates about each health unit.

- The Counseling Center plans to hire additional counselors, psychiatry providers at a rate of \$120,000 per therapist and \$260,000 per psychiatrist. They also plan to help with coordination and decentralize the campus, hire staff to build a culture of care at an estimated cost of \$115,000
- Husky Health will hire additional physicians at a cost of roughly \$500,000 per physician annually. They'll also invest in care coordination and insurance navigation at a cost of \$390,000 per year
- LiveWell will be expanding its suicide prevention program at a cost of \$125,000, adding alcohol and other drugs educational consults at a cost of \$125,000. They also plan to bring the confidential advocate program back. **Haley** clarified that hiring people for these new programs is one of the reasons for the high cost

Aiden gave an approximate estimation of what the Health units were receiving before from SAF. Husky Health had 71%, the Counseling Center had around 27% and LiveWell had 2%.

- **Haley** explained that the units did say they'd change the split if they got the Health Fee

Riley added that the 20% going to LiveWell would exponentially expand their services.

- **Aiden** agreed this would be a great increase for LiveWell and a decrease for Husky Health Center, expressing their concern
- **Haley** added that LiveWell plans to move to a bigger space, hire more people, and greatly expand their programs at a cost of \$400,000
- **Tammy** wanted to know what position they have now
- **Haley** responded that they currently have peer health wellness coaches and a peer health manager. There are no dedicated staff for the alcohol and drug consults and the suicide prevention programs
- **Riley** commented that the scale for this is really small. **Haley** agreed
- **Aiden** is concerned that Husky Health is not getting enough money to improve its services with the new funding distribution.

Gen asked if there are student interactions, such as more outreach for health services.

- **Kristian** asked to make last year's proposals available
- **Haley** responded, saying that the proposals are available on the SAF website

Helena wanted to know how the increase in staff is reflected in the number of students they provide service to.

Haley found out that for the Health Fee at Washington State University (WSU), while students do pay some out-of-pocket for physical health, they get unlimited counseling for no out-of-pocket cost.

- **Aiden** asked for the rate, such as how many appointments a student gets per month
- **Haley** said it's limited by demand, the number of appointments WSU provides. At UW, students only get 6 appointments.
