2. Login to LinguaFolio Online: <u>https://linguafolio.uoregon.edu/</u>

- **Update the Checklists** starting with Novice Low and moving up to higher levels. (Go until you can no longer select "I Can Do" for all Can Do statements.)
- Update your Profile (add languages) and Passport, when you have time.
- 3. After you have checked a statement as "I Can Do," add Evidence. (Note: Be sure to type in the title for each piece of evidence)

For practice, complete these three writing tasks and one speaking task:

- Novice Low, Presentational Writing. Title: Name CanDo: I can write my name. (Evidence: Type in your name in Russian)
- Novice Low, Presentational Writing. Title: Label objects CanDo: I can label some familiar things. (Evidence: Type in a list of objects you see in the room around you)
- Novice Mid, Presentational Writing. Title: About me CanDo: I can write about myself using learned phrases and memorized expressions. (Evidence: Type in a few sentences describing yourself, your name, your age, where you go to school, where you live, what you like to do. Etc....)
- Novice Mid, Presentational Speaking. Title: Likes & Dislikes
 CanDo: I can express my likes and dislikes using words, phrases, and memorized expressions.
 (Evidence: Record which sports you like and dislike in simple words or phrases, e.g., I like baseball. I don't like football. Etc....)
