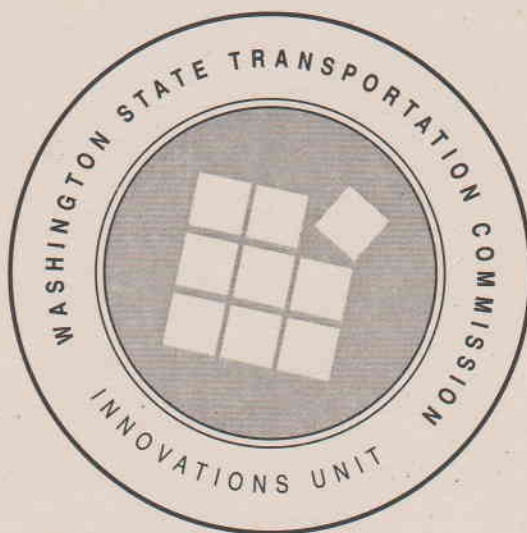

### METRO REFERENCES

Because the Metro Library is primarily a business facility, it does not have any major abstracts or indexes. It does carry a few recent Urban Mass Transportation Association (UMTA) Abstracts and HRIS Abstracts. The librarians use TRIS on-line to accommodate research projects. The small reference section is located on the north side of the library. The library has an extensive collection of the Transportation Research Board's Transportation

Research Record Reports, and they are located in the general stacks under the call number: TE7/H5. They all carry a fair number of the Transportation Research Board's publications.

### PSRC REFERENCES

The Puget Sound Regional Council Library does not house indexes or abstracts in its collection. It does, however, have transportation related bibliographies mixed into the general stacks. It also has extensive holdings of the Transportation Research Board-Transportation Research Record Reports. Also, contained in the stacks is a complete and well maintained series of the Puget Sound Regional Council reports, dating from its inception in 1957.

Space limitations and recent policy changes mean that librarians have to discard some materials. They plan to throw away materials that are not directly related to the Puget Sound area. Discardable material is available to anyone interested. Ask librarians.

### SUZZALLO REFERENCES

Suzzallo's reference section does contain some transportation related bibliographies and general references. However, most of the reference materials are in the Architecture and Engineering libraries. Reference materials in Suzzallo can be located by subject, or key-word searches, using Willow, UWIN, or the GEAC on-line system.

## Finding Urban Mass Transit Admin. Reports

**Engineering Library. Librarians at the Engineering Library suggest the following steps for finding a particular report.**

1. Find the report you are looking for using the printed NTIS abstracts, the Government Reports Announcements (for reports before 1990), or the on-line NTIS (for reports after 1983). Search techniques include using key word or subject combined with corporate source, in this case, the Urban Mass Transit Administration.
2. From either source, write down the AN# (microfiche number) and the RN# (printed report number).
3. First check the paper reports that are located on the south side of the fourth floor. The stacks are labeled "Technical Reports" and are arranged alphabetically. You are searching for UMTA combined with the RN#.
4. If not found in paper, you should check the microfiche with the respective AN# in the reference section on the first floor.
5. If you still cannot find the report, and it was written before 1985, you should check the appropriate year's Department of Energy microfiche under "Reports" using the AN#. Ask the librarian if you need help.
6. Another method of finding an AN# or RN# is to search the University of California's on-line resource database through Willow. The name of the database is MELVYL and it can be accessed through any computer on campus or through a home account. Use a key-word search combined with Urban Mass Transportation Administration.
