Turkish at University of Washington Information By Kağan Ark

Turkish is being taught in the Near Eastern Languages and Civilization department. There are currently first year and second year Turkish courses.

The first year Turkish is being taught by Dr. Kemal Silay who is from Ankara. There are 18 students in the class. He also teaches Turkish Literature, Ottoman Literature, Ottoman Turkish and Islamic Culture courses.

Second year Turkish is taught by Kagan Ark. There are 8 students. They have organized a Turkish Circle which meets once a week. They show Turkish movies, have Turkish food and give talks about Turkey. Guests are welcome to attend the gatherings of the circle. DELICIOUS DINING by Melissa Firuz

I am happy to report that we now have several excellent choices of TURKISH restaurants to choose from in the Seattle area. Guner and I have lived here for almost 20 years. When we first moved here there were almost no choices for a good Turkish meal at a restaurant! There was the original Turkish Delight opened by the Bozatli's in the Pike street market, and there was a restaurant co-owned by Muazez on University Way.

Now, after all these years we have a large selection of new and established restaurants to go to if we want Turkish food.

The restaurant that has been with us longest is the TURKISH DELIGHT in Pike Place Market. This busy establishment has been owned and operated by Ahmet and Semra Yavuz for many years. When you stop there for a delicious lunch, you will see many people, American and Turk enjoying such things as Döner, Börek, soup, salads, and much more. Don't forget to save room for a desert of the famous Turkish Delight, Baklava or pastries. I especially love such simple pleasures as visne suyu. You can expect a wonderful meal with views of the bustling market and the Seattle waterfront. Their busy city location, and delicious food reminds me of Istanbul.

Semra's sister Songül, also has a lunch shop in Pike Place Market. Her shop, SABRA MIDDLE EASTERN SANDWICH SHOP, has been opened for about 5 years. She makes mostly vegetarian sandwiches and lunches, such as falafel, humus, babaganus, tabouli, kebab, soup and salad.

If you live on the Eastside, you will have many choices for Turkish meals. For those who live in Bellevue, we all know about EBRU at Crossroads mall. The owner Bülent has been in business there for many years. He has been so busy that he had to move across the mall to a larger location where he could cook more delicious food. Try his chicken or his daily specials. I am sure that you will return for more, especially if you go to Crossroads in the evening when there is live free great entertainment. The eating areas are all filled with lots of people enjoying the many choices of food and visiting while they eat and listen to the jazz, blues, swing or country music.

In Kirkland we all know about MEZE. This delecatessant style restaurant with "the Mediterranean taste" was opened to rave reviews and has continued to be a popular place for the Kirkland crowd. Sedat and Ibrahim's delicious fresh foods will whet your taste buds, and he has many imported items for sale.

For those of you on the west side try a rather new restaurant called EPHESUS, in West Seattle This beautiful free standing house is elegantly decorated in a soft Turkish style. I love the butter yellow walls. The owner, Hasan had another pizza restaurant near his new place for years.

His experience and style are well displayed here. He has future plans for out door dining on the patio which has beautiful views of the sound and West Seattle.

In the Greenwood area of Seattle there is a new cafe called KISMET CAFE. The owner Turabi is not new to the Seattle area, but we will enjoy his expansion into the new cafe.

Moving north of Seattle we will find another jewel in our Turkish dining necklace. The SCHNITZELBANK EUROPEAN DINING has long been an area favorite restaurant. The NEW OWNERS Hakan and Semra will add new Turkish flavors to the already extensive European menu. This is another large restaurant where we can gather together. There is seating for over 200, a private party room for up to 70, a cocktail lounge. There will also be a catering business available. Come see the interesting ornately carved wooden decorations and enjoy food and dancing to Turkish music.

News Headlines from Turkey:

- New parliament opened with oath after a marathon session. But party leaders were no nearer to forming a government after December 1995 election.
- Erbakan assigned to form the government receives cold shoulder from the center right. Tansu Çiller is next trying to form government.
- Turkish foreign investment permits boom in 1995 reaching a high of \$2.938
- Turkey integrates with European Union(EU). The European Parliament voted to allow customs union between the European Union and Turkey to be effective as January 1,1996. The vote opens the way for Turkey to have one of the most privileged relationships with the 15 nation EU.
- Turkish President, Suleyman Demirel, visited BAKU and encouraged democracy in Azerbaijan.
- Assembly of Turkish American Associations (ATAA) officials visited Turkey and met with the Turkish president and private sector representatives to discuss the US - Turkish relations.

Turkish-Americans Condemn CBS Report

On Sunday, Jan. 14, members of the Turkish-American community who have tuned into CBS's 60 Minutes program were shocked by the one-sided segment "An American Dilemma" by Ed Bradley. Bradley posing in front of a Turkish flag on which a scull with a bullet was placed, tried to make the case that Turkish citizens of Kurdish origin were tortured and persecuted with arms provided and supported by U.S. tax dollars.

Allocating air time almost entirely to anti-Turkish claims and interviewing only one Turkish Government representative, Bradley painted a picture of a brutal, undemocratic Turkey in a manner unbecoming of objective journalism.

Interviewing Congressman Porter, a well known adversary of Turkey, Bradley covered Porter's sweeping statements on recent Turkish democratic reforms as "cosmetic changes", and did not provide any details on Turkey's constitutional reforms toward democratization and the revision of Article 8 of the Anti-terrorism law. In November, about two thirds of the individuals serving sentences for Art. 8 offenses had been released in accordance with the new legislation. These changes were seen as big steps towards further democratization by the US State Department and other Western European governments.

Concerned individuals flooded ATAA and the Turkish Times with calls criticizing the biased reporting and urged for a strong reaction. ATAA is contacting CBS to voice objection and request a correction in regard to factual errors made during the program. The Turkish Times urges all members of the Turkish-American community and friends of Turks to react strongly against this biased reporting by writing to:

Let Us Do More In 1996

Excerpts from Ambassador Nuzhet Kandemir's Article in Turkish Times January1,1996

> While it is true that we have accomplished much together in 1995. the New Year offers enormous opportunities to achieve even more. We should also consider the fact that 1996 will also be an election year in the US. This will open up certain opportunities for anti-Turkey lobbies to intensify their misinformation campaign, with the risk of creating tensions in Turkish-American relations. Therefore, the Turkish-American Community must counter such efforts effectively, actively and loudly. Though our community is small in quantity, we certainly have quality on our side. Such anti-Turkey lobbies, who team up with each other on the basis of the old adage "my enemy's enemy is my friend" should be silenced by existence of strong and natural bonds between Turkey and the US, based on the contemporary values, norms and interests we hold in common.

> Thus, I am calling on Turks and Turkish-Americans to reach out to friends, neighbors, Representatives and Senators in order to convey the truth about Turkey and to encourage them to visit Turkey. Only through this can we render the misinformation campaign against Turkey ineffective. Let us do all this and more in 1996.

With all this in mind, it is my sincere wish that the New Year will bring health, prosperity, happiness and success to Turkey and the United States, as well as to the Turkish-American community who is the organic bridge between our two countries.




