

Protocol: Fetus >24 Weeks with new low heart rate What should a sonographer do?

Normal fetal heart rate >24 weeks is between 120-170bpm

A prolonged fetal **heart rate of less than 100bpm** may be a serious problem. While you are scanning a fetus and the heart rate stays below 100bpm for longer than 30 seconds – these are the things that should be done:

- 1. Try to keep scanning the fetal heart while there is bradycardia
- 2. Put patient in LLD position (this reduces pressure on the IVC)
- 3. If on the Montlake Campus, Quickly call up to L and D (8-9599) and ask to talk with the CHARGE NURSE
- 4. Give the charge nurse the patient's hospital number, date of birth and name
- 5. Bring patient up to Labor and Delivery (6South) immediately.
