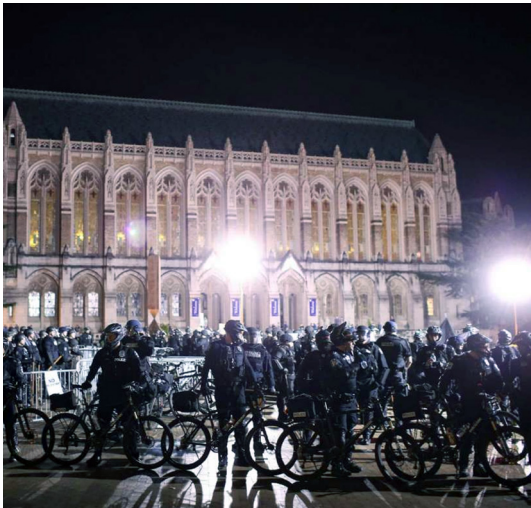


Beyond Policing: Reimagining Campus Safety

UW American Association of University Professors (AAUP) forum on the idea of eliminating the UW police department

The campus police system costs millions. Can those resources be used for a system that is racially just and creates safety for all?

The culture and the practice of policing has clearly failed us.

UW's police force was recently sued by its African American officers for its climate of "unbearable racism."



Speakers will address the history of campus policing, alternative models of campus safety at other universities, and progress at UW on policing alternatives.

Panelists

Michael Hames-García is Professor of Mexican American and Latina/o Studies at the University of Texas at Austin. His teaching and scholarship addresses inequality and injustice with regard to policing and mass incarceration.

Michael Magee is an organizer with AAUP, who supports advocacy chapters in planning and executing issue campaigns. He is a co-author (with Michael Hames-García) of the AAUP's report On Campus Police Forces.

Nick Mitchell is Associate Professor of Feminist Studies and Critical Race and Ethnic Studies at UC Santa Cruz. His research addresses the institutional projects of black studies and women's studies in the post-Civil Rights U.S. university, and rethinks current debates within the field of critical university studies.

Danielle Brown is a poet, artist, and PhD student in Geography at the University of Washington, Seattle. As a research assistant, she worked with SafeCampus and faculty members in Public Health to explore existing mental health resources and crisis response strategies that do not involve police.

The forum will feature short presentations with extended opportunity for Q&A and open discussion.
