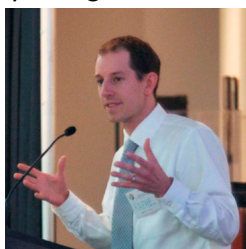

UWAC research cited in 2012 Top Ten lists

For the second year in a row, UW Autism Center researchers have contributed to scientific papers that were recognized in the Top Ten for 2012 by both Autism Speaks and the Simons Foundation Autism Research Initiative (SFARI). Dr. Raphael Bernier contributed to important research identifying common gene mutations in children with ASD. Work conducted by Dr. Sara Webb, in conjunction with Dr. Michael Murias, Dr. Susan Faja, and other collaborators, found a link between participation in early intervention and changes in brain activity in young children with ASD.
