# **Training Workshops**

# Classroom and Program-Based Consultations

UW Autism Center specialists provide classroom observations and consultations to help teachers and other school personnel implement evidence-based practices to maximize the learning of students with ASD. Areas of consultation may focus on:

- Using physical structure and visual supports
- ✓ Integrating different teaching methods
- ✓ Incorporating social skills instruction into daily activities
- ✓ Collecting data to measure success



# Individual Student-Focused Consultations

UW Autism Center clinicians offer studentfocused consultations to assist with IEP development and offer recommendations for improving learning and behavior for individual students. Areas of consultation may include:

- ✓ Identifying student skill levels
- ✓ Conducting Functional Behavior Assessments (FBAs)
- ✓ Developing Behavior Intervention Plans (BIPs) to decrease problem behaviors and increase appropriate behaviors and skills
