Supporting Students with AAC at Home and in the Classroom

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) includes a variety of methods to support and supplement communication. As educators, staff, related professionals, and parents, we can support children using AAC to gain better mastery of systems and facilitate language and communication in the school and home environment. In this webinar, participants will explore partner strategies and identify opportunities to use AAC throughout the day. At the end of the session, breakout groups of parents and professionals will be facilitated to provide practice on how to support children with AAC during a variety of activities in their specific settings.
