Social communication differences are a hallmark of Autism Spectrum Disorder. Teaching social skills can be a challenging but important task for educators, providers, and parents. In the first half of the presentation, we will cover social communication development with special consideration for cultural and linguistically-diverse populations. In the second half, the presenters will discuss how to support teachers and clinicians in creating goals and practices while celebrating neurodiversity of all students. This session is led by speech language pathologist, James Engracia M.A. CCC-SLP, and Dr. Natasha Lewis Harrington, psychologist and autistic advocate.


