Remote Support for Transitioning to Adulthood

Approximately 100,000 individuals with autism turn 18 years old each year (Shattuck, 2019). As a caregiver or provider for an individual on the cusp of adulthood, it is important to support them as they prepare for this transition. In this webinar, participants will increase their understanding of how to collaborate with individuals to create goals for skill development necessary in adulthood. Strategies to teach these skills will be presented with special considerations for remote learning. This training will also address how to build and maintain motivation while learning new skills. Caregivers and providers attending this training will have the opportunity to discuss and troubleshoot barriers to learning at home.
