



## **Could I Be Autistic?** A Webinar for the Self-Diagnosed or Wondering

## **Meet the Instructors**



**Dr. Lucas Harrington**, Psy.D., is a psychologist at the UW Autism Center. Dr. Harrington received his Psy.D. from the California School of Professional Psychology at Alliant International University, and trained as a postdoctoral fellow at UW's LEND program as well as the UW Autism Center. During his undergraduate years he received training at the Claremont Autism Center. Dr. Harrington is autistic himself

His main goals are to create programs that address the high suicide and unemployment rates that impact Autistic people. He also works to reduce the disparities that Autistic

people with intersectional identities are forced to endure. He works as the Disability Systems Navigation coordinator at the Arc of King County (https://arcofkingcounty.org/). He organizes the Square Pegs (https://www.meetup.com/Squarepegs/), a series of 25 social and support groups for Autistic adults in Washington State. He is on the board of the Washington Initiative for Supportive Employment (https://www.gowise.org/), a nationally renowned organization that promotes equitable employment for people with developmental disabilities through innovation, training and technical assistance.

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
