SUMMER CLINICAL INTERNSHIP AT APEX SUMMER CAMP 2024

The Apex Summer Camp program at the University of Washington Autism Center offers 6-week clinical internships to graduate and undergraduate students focusing on medicine, psychology, education, speech language pathology, occupational therapy, nursing, and related fields.

Apex Summer Camp is a 4-week intensive therapeutic day camp designed specifically for children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and other neurodevelopmental disabilities.

The program is located in Seattle, Washington. We have hosted staff from around the country to participate in the program. This has included students from Columbia, Cornell, Gonzaga, Harvard, Loyola, UPenn, Scripps, UCLA, Berkeley, University of Melbourne, Minnesota, Ohio, Oregon, Texas, Washington, Wesleyan, Yale, and many more.

Before camp, staff complete two weeks of intensive training to implement the program. This includes didactic sessions, direct readings, case-reviews and supervision, and rehearsal and practice of program components.

Camp Dates: July 1 to July 26th
Monday through Friday 8am to 5pm



Consulting experts present during training on key topics related to autism spectrum disorders and neurodiverse populations including etiology, genetics, applied behavior analysis, pivotal response treatment, social skills training, data-based evaluation, and principles of autism intervention.

We offer training opportunities to graduate and undergraduate students interested in gaining a unique clinical experience working with children with ASD, ADHD and more. Supervision is provided by licensed psychologists, board certified behavior analysts, and speech-language pathologists. Undergraduate course credit is also available.
