Child neglect is the most common form of child maltreatment, and the least well understood with regard to both risk factors and consequences. This presentation will first provide a broad overview of child neglect, including prevalence, trends, risk factors and consequences. Then, we will describe intervention and preventive approaches for addressing child neglect including the SafeCare model. Finally, we will discuss implementation issues that should be considered when implementing any evidence-based program.

Daniel J. Whitaker, Ph.D. is currently a Professor of Public Health and Director of the National SafeCare® Training and Research Center at Georgia State University. His research interests include intervention for child maltreatment, dissemination of evidence-based practices, and intimate partner violence.

Shannon Self-Brown, Ph.D. is Associate Professor of Public Health and Associate Director of the National SafeCare® Training and Research Center at Georgia State University. Her research interests include youth exposed to violence, child maltreatment, and disaster, and the evaluation of dissemination/implementation efforts for child maltreatment prevention programs.
