Cognitive Processing Therapy (CPT) is an evidence-based cognitive-behavioral therapy for PTSD and related conditions that can be used with individuals or groups. Multiple randomized clinical trials have found significant effects for CPT in reduction of PTSD symptoms across trauma-exposed populations. CPT lasts for 12-15 sessions and involves psychoeducation; optional written account of the traumatic event; examining patients' interpretations of traumatic events; and cognitive restructuring of their beliefs that have been disrupted by traumatic events.

Part I: October 21-22, 2019. Core Clinical Training

For mental health therapists and behavioral health clinicians who provide therapy to adult victims of trauma and who will have active cases to present for the telephone case consultations

Part II: Telephone Clinical Consultation

Two options are offered. Option 1: Twice monthly for 6 months (12 calls) Option II: Twice monthly for 10 months (20 calls)

- 60 minute telephone consultations with a CPT expert
- Present two active cases, which will include brief background information, standardized measures scores, sample worksheets, and demonstration of how you are applying CPT
- A <u>certificate of completion</u> will be granted to those who participate in at least 9 consultation calls
