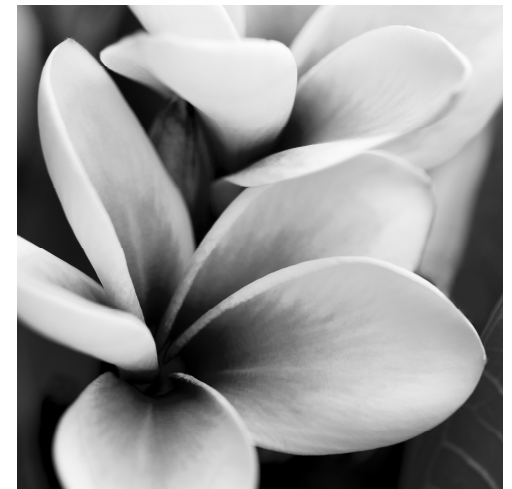

# Harborview Center for Sexual Assault and Traumatic Stress

## Program Services

### *Medical Services*

Emergency care after sexual assault/abuse.

Scheduled medical exams for non-acute sexual assault, child abuse, and neglect.

Forensic exams and documentation for court purposes.

Consultation for medical, legal and child welfare professionals.

There are no fees for initial medical examinations for the purpose of gathering evidence. Fees for follow-up medical services are on a sliding scale. Crime Victims

Compensation, Medicaid, and other third party payers may apply. The center can help arrange coverage.

### *Evaluation Services*

Psychosocial evaluations: specialized evaluations to assess suspected sexual assault in children.

Evaluation and treatment: provided for young children with sexual behavior problems.

Foster Care Assessment Program (FCAP): provides a comprehensive assessment of a child's level of functioning in the home, school and community. Assists with service planning and implementation. FCAP referrals are accepted from DSHS only.

### *Counseling and Advocacy Services*

We provide brief crisis response; information and referral; advocacy; and support services at no charge. Please talk with your provider about these services and what is available to you.

**Information and referral:** resources and assistance related to sexual assault and traumatic experiences.

**Crisis counseling and support:** assistance by phone or in person to victims/survivors and families.

**General, legal and medical advocacy:** providing support and assistance in accessing services. Providing help for victims to ensure their interests and rights are upheld in legal and medical systems.

**Evidence based therapy:** For the psychological effects of sexual assault, trauma, child abuse and crime.

**Parenting Interventions:** Parents learn specific skills to improve quality of parent-child relationships and effectively manage child behavior problems. Specific parenting programs offered.



### *Research and program evaluation*

Collaborative research projects on topics such as rape, abuse and neglect of children, violent crime, and accidents.
