



Evaluating EHE Implementation Workshop 2025

The Research Alliance in Implementation Science to End HIV (RAISE) at the University of Washington/Fred Hutch Center for AIDS Research, in collaboration with NASTAD, will host a **2.5-day in-person workshop on program evaluation, with a focus on implementation science methods**. This initiative aims to support Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) evaluators at local and state health departments with continuing education so they can incorporate implementation science methodologies into EHE program evaluations. We anticipate that most attendees will be master's level epidemiologists. By the end of the workshop, participants will have prepared an evaluation plan to assess the implementation of an EHE activity.

Evaluating EHE Implementation Workshop Overall Objectives:

1. Equip health department EHE evaluators with the background and tools needed to conduct mixed methods evaluations of implementation activities within their EHE programs
2. Provide dedicated time to develop an evaluation plan that evaluates the implementation of a selected activity or program in each jurisdiction
3. Facilitate peer-to-peer sharing and learning about program implementation and evaluation

- Interest in developing skills to systematically plan and evaluate the implementation of health department activities. Please note that prior training in implementation science is not a requirement.

What is the EHE program you'd be interested in focusing on during the workshop? What about the program are you interested in evaluating? (3-5 sentences) *

Please be as detailed as possible but note that we will have a pre-workshop videoconference focused on developing robust evaluation questions. A few examples are included below.

Evaluating a new program that implemented electronic medical record prompts about HIV testing -- "In the 6 months following implementation, were automated EHR prompts to conduct HIV testing among pregnant women in County X acceptable and feasible among providers?"

Evaluating a new community health worker program to implement intensive case management for PLWHIV -- "Did PLWHIV interacting with CHW in State Y ultimately have improved HIV care engagement and viral suppression? Why or why not?"
