

We are gearing up to go back to the legislature in 1999 for money for the new law school building. Now the project is estimated at \$74 million for the same 196,000 gross square feet we had planned. The law school would raise 1/3 privately. A decision by the legislature is not expected until late next Spring. Best scenario is to move in 2002; worst . . .


