GH Pathway Curriculum

- **Integrated Residency Global Health Leadership Course (GH 586; Alison Roxby)**
 - 1 month R2 year
 - Required, open to non-pathway residents
- **Independent mentored project**
 - 2-3 months duration R2/R3 years
 - Required, guaranteed for pathway residents
- **Interdepartmental rotation in Kenya - CEPI**
 - 1 month R2 or R3 year
 - Optional, open to non-pathway residents
- **Monthly GH Seminars**
 - First Monday of each month at 6:30pm UW Harris Hydraulics

Integrated Residency Global Health Leadership Course (GH 586)


Purpose: To teach residents interested in careers in Global Health the skills necessary to become future leaders in field

- Starting July 2016
- Mission Statement:
To train the next generation of leaders in medical field to bring dignified, justice-oriented, and sustainable improvements to the healthcare of vulnerable populations within global and local communities.

Program Overview

- 2 Year Fellowship
- Year 1: Rural Health Component
 - Clinical training at Alaska Native Medical Center or Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota
- Year 2: Live abroad and choose between 2 pathways:
 - Clinical Educator Pathway
 - Research Pathway
